At the Schools

NEW BUS HERE

The new bus for the band and sports teams traveling arrived in Sanderson last Thursday afternoon. The bus is a Chevrolet motor and chassis with a Superior body. It is equipped with individual leather-upholstered seats for 28 and has overhead racks for equipment and luggage with a luggage rack on top of the bus. The bus has flares, first aid kit, directional lights and an air-boosted hydraulic brake system.

Supt. J. G. Barry said that all of the male members of the faculty were to make application for a chauffeur's driving license so that there would be a sufficient number of drivers available for trips the bus might make. The bus is to be used in hauling the football, basketball and track teams and band or other school organizations or groups for school activities.

BASEBALL TEAM TO BE ORGANIZED

At a meeting of the boys in the high school last week they voted to try to organize a baseball team for the coming season and competition in the district. Plans will be worked out further, depending upon the ability after the team begins to take shape. Supt. Barry, who has had much experience in coaching baseball, will direct the boys during the season. Mr. Barry was coach for 17 years in high school baseball and for 2 years in the army.

During the time he was high school coach his team won 13 regional championships, competed in the state tournament in Dallas 6 years and finished in the top three brackets each year winning the state championship in 1939. Supt. Barry was elected as outstanding baseball coach of the state that year.

He said that he thinks the material is here for a winning team for the coming spring if he is able to find a pitcher.

SOUTHERN ASSOCIATION APPROVES LOCAL SCHOOL

In a letter dated December 5 from Gordon Worley, chairman, Texas executive committee of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, he announced that the Sanderson school system had been approved for membership in that organization. His recommendation was that the local school improve its library facilities by hiring a competent librarian with the required number of hours of study in that field, but that this action was not necessary to retain membership in the association.

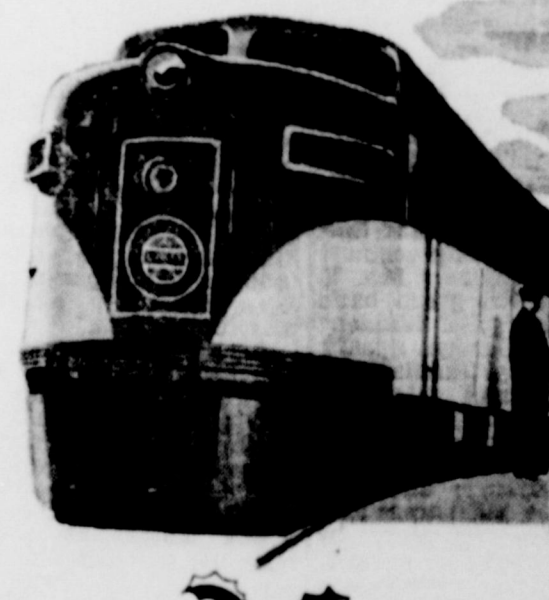
