#### SCHOOL TO START CONSTRUCTION ON BAND BUILDING At a meeting of the school

board Monday night, final arrangements were made to proceed with the building program authorized by the voters of Terrell oounty last November when they approved a \$50,000 bond issue. The issue of the bonds has been held up by a technicality. and has finally been validated by the legislature.

The Columbian Securities Corporation has purchased \$30-000 of the bonds, and the board will use this money for the immediate construction and equipping of a much-needed band building, the purchase of equipment for the shop department, some repairs to the high school and elementary school buildings. moving the superintendent's home to a new location and building a bus garage.

The remaining \$20,000 of the bond issue will be held by the board and sold if and when needed for further construction.




