Mr. and Mrs. H. M. Schmidt and children are on their annual vacation, visiting her relatives in Springfield, Mo.

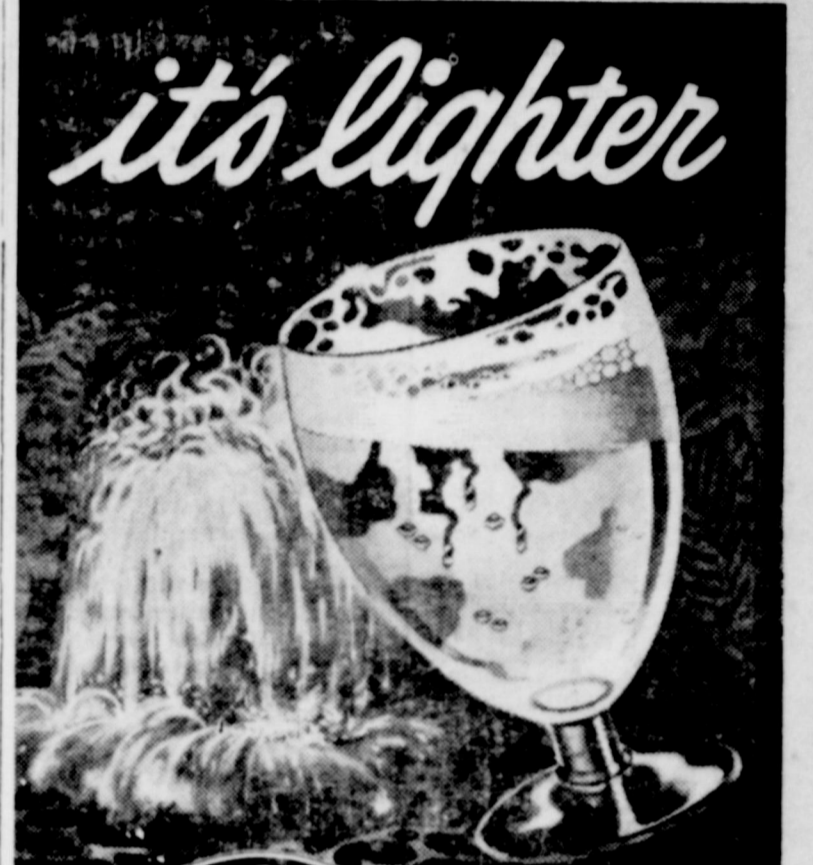
