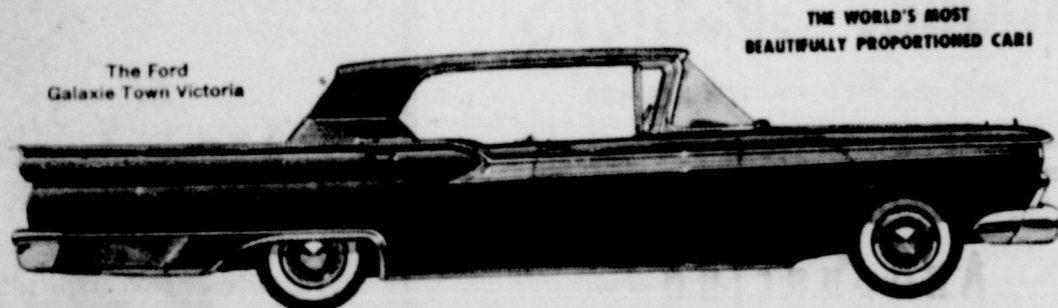

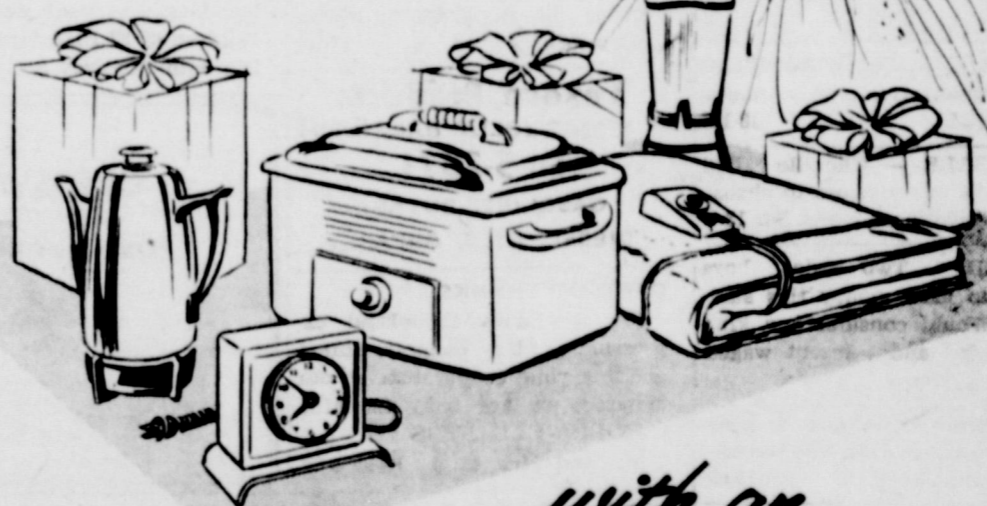

### Building Dedicated At Girl Scout Camp

The new \$40,000 Lodge at Mitre Peak Girl Scout Camp near Alpine was dedicated Sunday afternoon.

R. J. Ream of Andrews, president of the Permian Basin Council, presented keys to the building to three campers present at the dedication ceremony.

Dedicatory speaker for the occasion was Mrs. John Camp of San Antonio, a member of the national camp committee of the Girl Scouts of the U.S.A.

Girl Scout cookie sales are financing the building. Contributions of material and labor has cut the actual cost to the Council to less than \$30,000. Jack Lemmon of Andrews is the architect and C. W. Burdett of Alpine has supervised construction.

The building has developed from a dream to a reality in the six months since the Permian Basin Council at its annual meeting November 8, 1958, in McCombs, authorized its construction. Many board and committee meetings followed. An architect was employed, sketches became detailed plans, and a construction supervisor was engaged. Actual construction began February 1, 1959. Although a delay in securing materials held up construction at a few points, the building has progressed for the most part, ahead of schedule. It was ready for campers when they moved in June 7.

The lodge will be used as a dining hall and can accommodate a capacity of 150 campers. Kitchen equipment for the lodge including a 10-burner range, two ovens, sterilizing sink, steel cabinets, deep freeze and ice maker has been donated by District 1 (Midland). District II (Odessa) purchased tables and benches for the dining hall. The Andrews neighborhood in District II has donated the furnishings for the staff room in the lodge.

Over-all size of the building is 51,000 square feet. It is situated near the entrance to Fern Canyon, with the expanse of front windows looking out on Mitre Peak, the peak from which the camp gets its name.

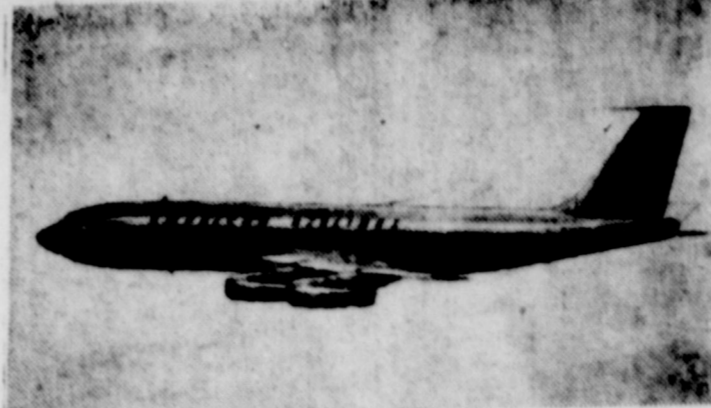
