Governor Urges For Holidays

Governor Price Daniel said this week that he had "high hopes that Texans will make the Christ mas-New Year's season one of the safest instead of the most dead! we have ever had on Texas high-

A prediction of 111 traffic deaths, one of the largest in recent years, had been made by the Texas Department of Public Safety due to the 12-day length of the holiday period and its two week

The Governor said he had mailed nearly 11,000 letters to college and public school officials, local traffic safety officials, local law enforcement agencies, newspapers, radio and television stations and others interested in the statewide traffic safety crusade. "I have asked all these Texans, and I appeal to all of the automobile drivers in this state, to join in the most talked-about, most publicized and most effective safety campaign we have ever staged during Christmas time," the Gov-

ernor said. The Governor stated that he telt it his duty to remind Texans again and again that if their homes are to remain secure and their families complete for what should be the happiest season of the year, then the members of those families need to drive more carefully than ever before.

"Nothing can make a happy Christmas more certain than careful driving and obedience to the traffic laws, designed for our personal safety," he stated.

Warnings of TB For Young and Old

"The youngsters on this year's Christmas Seals couldn't be more delightful," Jack Hayre, chairman of the Terrell County Christmas Seal Sale, commented today. "It's a shock when you realize that there are children every bit as charming who became desperately ill with tuberculosis caught from someone who loves them dearly."

"Tuberculosis authorities say that elderly people are a frequent source of tuberculosis infection Grandfather may have picked up the TB germ years ago, when even those who lived best knew little and bothered less about what causes disease," he continued.

Mr. Hayre stated that older people often carry the TB germ around in their lungs for years without knowing it. Then as advancing age weakens them, the germ becomes active and catching. "But grandfather doesn't know it. And nobody else thinks enything of that morning cough lack of appetite, loss of weight, constant tiredness. What do you expect?" they say, 'He's getting on in years. Nearly seventy."

"But grandfather pickes up the children and kisses them. They sit on his lap while he tells them stories. He spends as much time with the little ones as he can. And his illness may be a threat to them."

"If there are elderly people in your household, they should be tuberculin tested, and if the test is positive, they should have X-rays regularly," he concluded "In fact, the wisest move is for every person in the family to get a tuberculin test or chest X-ray once a year at the time of his medical check-up."
