When warmer weather gets here there is going to have to be some more work done to local streets, too. The water did a lot of damage to Downie St. and the subsequent repair work has not held up too well under all the traffic that has been giving punishment to the streets. Particularly noticeable is the corner of Downie and Persimmon where there is so much traffic going to the post office.

It is continually a source of amazement to us that the fighting in Vietnam continues and continues, and continues, with reports stating that we are making headway, when the casualty lists continue to grow, the number of men going to that country to fight a war continues to increase, the cost of the action financially continues to increase, and there is only a gradual increase in the quality of arms that are being used.

93 SHEEP KILLED BY DOGS ON ERNEST HARKINS RANCH

Ernest Harkins reported that 93 sheep had been killed in one seige on his ranch by dogs recently.

Few of the animals were left alive by the dogs, whose tracks were prevalent at the kills, and none of them were eaten after the kill, and there was very little chewing of the animals. Many of them were only grabbed on the muzzle and killed outright.

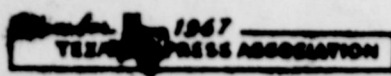
