John C. White said the federal program will now permit an individual farmer to qualify if
he derives a majorit of gross income or devotes. of his
time to his livestock or poultry operation. Formerly, individual farmers had to do both to qualify. Part nerships or corporations must
still satisfy both requirements to get loan guarantees. The law was passed July 25 and permits the Farmers Home Administration, a rural credit service of the U.S. Departmen of Agriculture, to guarantee up to 80 percent of losses on loans made by private lending in the livestock or poultry industry.
