Arrington Statement on Air Force Announcement

No group of Americans believe more adamantly in the defense of this country and the mission of our military to keep us safe, strong and free than the people of West Texas." Arrington added.

Three earn Feather in Your Cap honors

The Amarillo Police Department recognized officers Justin Griffith, Jose Samarron, and Christina Harrison for its weekly Feather in Your Cap Friday

On Jan. 6, 2019, officers were checking a residence on NE Sixth Avenue for a subject wanted for a domestic violence related aggravated assault with a deadly

The occupants who answered the door told officers neither the suspect nor the home owner, who was also the victim, were in the house. The officers asked to search the home and were denied, due to the homeowner not being there.

As Griffith and Samarron were talking with the occupants at the front door, Harrison was watching the back of the house. Harrison saw a male subject who matched the description of the suspect exit the house and she pursued him on foot while notifying the other officers via police radio. Griffith ran to help Harrison, while Samarron stayed with the occupants of the house. Harrison was able to catch the subject and she and Samarron placed him in custody and brought him back to the residence.

The male subject was booked in jail for his aggravated assault with a deadly weapon warrant; the two occupants who answered the door were arrested for hindering apprehension of a known

Because these types of assaults can sometimes result in homicides, APD and the other local law enforcement

agencies are trying to be proactive in working cases and making arrests involving serious injuries and threats that are domestic violence related.



DSEC holds 81st Annual Membership Meeting

The Deaf Smith Electric Cooperative held its 81st Annual Membership Meeting on Tuesday, March 19th at the Hereford Bull Barn in Hereford, Texas. More that a 1,000 attendees enjoyed a catered meal of fish, chicken, and beef. The Hereford Junior ROTC presented the colors and Faith Diaz, a student at Hereford High School, sang the National Anthem. Chairman of the Board Donald Wright welcomed the crowd. All military veterans in attendance were recognized. The auditor said DSEC was strong financially with an 86% equity position and little out-

standing debt. Next, Danny Hand of

Friona gave the secretary's report.

DSEC President and GM Mike Veazey presented the annual Manager's Report. He said the cooperative had a really great year in 2018, and he couldn't see rates getting any lower than they were last year. He said the average cost in 2018 was 8¢/kilowatt hour, and the normal rate is around 10¢/kilowatt hour. He stressed that transmission costs are the only upward pressure on rates, and electricity prices should remain stable for 2019. Mr. Veazev also mentioned that DSEC lost around 75 utility poles during the big windstorm a couple of weeks ago,

and 52 employees worked on the repairs which included 4000 miles of transmission lines.

Michael Carlson and Vick Christian were re-elected as directors with a total of 495 members voting. Deaf Smith Electric Cooperative members received capital credit refunds that totaled \$4 million dollars. DSEC employees were recognized and applauded for their oustanding service. At the conclusion of the meeting, a few lucky attendees received door prizes that totaled over \$1,500.00. Reyna Nunez won the grand prize of two Southwest Airline tickets.



County Commissioners allocate permanent school funds

The Parmer County Commissioners Court met in regular session on Monday, March 11th at 10:00 a.m. in the County Courtroom of the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas. The meeting began with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and the Texas

Parmer County Commissioners allocated \$4.5 million of Permanent School Funds to the four school districts using a newly developed formula required by the State of Texas. Friona ISD will receive \$2,204,100 (48.98%), Bovina ISD will receive \$1,101,150 (24.47%), Farwell ISD will receive \$958,950 (21.31%), and Lazbuddie ISD will receive \$235,800 (5.24%). The funds will be deposited as CDs in the name of each school district and will be available by request under the current expenditure rules and regulations.

The Commissioners approved the disposal of microfilm camera equipment that was being stored in the County Clerk's office. Besides being over 30 years old, the equipment was non-operational and replacement parts were no longer available.

The Court also approved a motion stating that the County Election Precincts were in compliance with the Election Code. This determination is required to be made every two years. The Court reaffirmed its right-of-way easement on County Road A1. The existence of the easement was brought to the Court's attention by the Caviness company which had recently been granted permission to purchase an adjacent one acre plot.

The Farwell ISD requested \$25,623 from the Permanent School Fund for their Ag Farm and presented their receipts to the Court. The request was approved. The Bovina ISD requested \$25,000 from the Fund for their Ag Farm and barn. Action on the request was tabled until a full accounting of the total costs could be determined.

Approval was given for compensation to be given for additional work that was needed in the Treasurer's Office after last year's election. Retired former treasurer Altha Herrington had been working in the office to help newly elected treasurer Sharon May with the transition. The Court also approved moving the April 22nd meeting to April 29th because Sharon will be attending a training seminar.

Sheriff Randy Geries reported that he was currently housing 41 inmates and that 17 were from Castro County. The Law Enforcement Center received \$19,435.60 from Castro County to house inmates for the month of February.

In other business, the Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved. Approval was given for payment of the accounts payables as presented by County Treasurer Sharon May. The Commissioners also reviewed the Treasurer's Report and approved the calculated payroll and disbursement for all county employees and elected officials. The next scheduled Commissioner's Court meeting is at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, April 8th.

Texas Weekly Fuel Update and Outlook

Texas gas prices have risen 8.3 cents per gallon in the past survey of 13,114 stations. Gas prices in Texas are 26.3 cents per vision Within Section 49 Block A gallon higher than a month ago, yet stand 2.7 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

Texas is priced at \$2.09 today while the most expensive is \$3.19, a difference of \$1.10 per gallon. The lowest price in the state today is \$2.09 while the highest is \$3.19, a difference of \$1.10 per gallon. The cheapest price in the entire country today stands at \$1.12 while the most expensive is \$5.04, a difference of \$3.92 per gallon.

The national average price of gasoline has risen 6.5 cents per gallon in the last week, averaging \$2.62/g today. The national average is up 22.2 cents per gallon from a month ago, yet stands 2.1 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

"Gasoline prices have increased in all fifty states in the last week as refineries continue working toward cleaner, more expensive gasoline and as oil prices have continued creeping higher," said Patrick DeHaan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. "There shouldn't be any surprises that prices continue to migrate higher given the warnings in the past few months, though that doesn't make it any easier for motorists to digest higher gas prices. 





A packing necessity is a large cooler we fill with fresh Gulf Shrimp when we come home. Then Bill furiously cleans and deveins shrimp for the next two days and fills the freezer with his rewards.

Although shrimping is foreign to those of us who live so far away from salt water, shrimp is a huge ag product in Texas. In fact, 83% of all US shrimp comes from the Texas Gulf. Americans eat an average of 4.10 pounds of shrimp per year. Shrimp are packed with essential amino acids, vitamins, and minerals. They are also a good source of pro-Twenty medium sized shrimp have about 140 calories and 25 grams

of protein.

Over one hundred species of shrimp are found throughout the world. However, the two main species that make Texas home are the brown shrimp and white shrimp. Pink shrimp can be found but not in large amounts. The brown shrimp are harvested at night in deeper waters. They can grow up to 9 inches long. They are best identified by the grooves on the top side of their head and the last segment on their tail. Their flavor is bold and hearty. White shrimp, on the other hand, are lighter and sweeter. They grow to about 8 inches and are grey in color. They are harvested in the shallow waters just off the coast.


When shopping for shrimp be sure to look for a firm and translucent shrimp. The shells should be shiny and in tact without any damage. The shrimp should smell fresh and mild, like the ocean. Without a trip to Galves-

ton, it is hard to come by fresh shrimp this far north, but frozen shrimp are a nice alternative. can be prepared just like fresh shrimp after defrosting them. In fact, the job is a little less work since you probably don't have to clean them yourself. Just remember that every time you freeze and thaw shrimp, you are diminishing its flavor and texture. It's important to thaw your shrimp the correct way as well. For a small amount of shrimp, you can defrost in the fridge overnight. For a speedier method, immerse shrimp sealed in a plastic bag in cold water. You can also thaw them in a colander under cold running water.

Add broth, lemon zest, lemon juice, pepper, salt and pepper flakes to same pan. Bring to a boil; cook until liquid is slightly reduced, about 1 minute. Return shrimp to pan; heat through. Remove from heat. Drain pasta; divide among four bowls. Top with shrimp mixture; sprinkle with parsley. If desired, serve with cheese.



Air pollution from tank fire sparks lawsuit

AUSTIN — Images of a stream of billowing dark smoke drew the nation's attention last week to a fire that engulfed 11 petrochemical storage tanks at the Intercontinental Terminals Company about 15 miles southeast of Houston in Deer Park.

On March 17, Gov. Greg Abbott ordered that all state resources be made available to local and industry officials and urged residents to heed the warnings of local officials. Governmental bodies in nearby affected areas ordered residents to shelter in place because of concerns about unhealthy air quality. Deer Park Independent School District and other districts canceled classes for several days.

The fire was extinguished on March 20. Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton on March 22 announced that his office, acting on behalf of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, had filed a lawsuit naming the tank storage company as the defendant. The lawsuit alleges that the fire caused air pollution from benzene, xylene, toluene and other contaminants, in violation of the Texas Clean Air Act.

In a statement accompanying the lawsuit, Paxton said, "No company can be allowed to disrupt lives and put public health and safety at risk."

The Chemical Safety Board, an independent federal agency charged with investigating industrial chemical accidents, announced March 21 that an investigation into the fire would be opened.

Jobless rate stays low

Texas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate held at 3.8 percent in February, according a March 22 news release by the Texas Workforce Commission.

The Midland Metropolitan Statistical Area recorded February's lowest unemployment rate with a non-seasonally adjusted rate of 2.2 percent, followed by the Odessa at 2.7 percent and Amarillo at 2.9 percent.

Growth in the Texas economy continued in February, with 17,700 seasonally adjusted non-farm positions added over the month.

TWC Chair and Commissioner Representing Employers Ruth R. Hughs said her agency "is committed to engaging with all employers across Texas to strengthen our economy and to create and expand opportunities for all."

TWC Commissioner Representing Labor Julian Alvarez added, "To ensure positive growth, we must continue to invest in necessary training and education for subsequent generations."

Ticketing system targeted

Photographic traffic signal enforcement systems would be banned under Senate Bill 653 by Sen. Bob Hall, R-Edgewood.

Hall seeks to prohibit municipalities and other local jurisdictions from using redlight cameras as a means of issuing traffic tickets.

In laying out his bill before the Senate Transportation Committee, Hall said that under the red light camera enforcement, "the innocent owner has then the burden of proof and often great expense of proving that they did not commit the alleged violation. This turns our judicial system completely and utterly upside down by requiring the accused to prove their innocence."

More than two dozen people testified for or against the bill in a March 20 Senate Transportation Committee hearing. Regents to examine policies

Gov. Abbott on March 18 sent a letter to all Texas public university boards of regents following the U.S. Department of Justice's investigation into an alleged college admissions bribery scheme.

In his letter, Abbott called for governing boards of Texas' institutions of higher education "to examine and investigate admissions policies and procedures to ensure that no university employee engages in fraudulent schemes, quid pro quo arrangements or improprieties of any sort." He added that Texas parents and students "must have confidence that the system is not rigged." **Busby joins high court**

Brett Busby of Houston on March 20 was confirmed by the Texas Senate and sworn in as the newest member of the Supreme Court of Texas for a term set to expire on Dec. 31, 2020.

Gov. Abbott nominated Busby on Feb. 21 to fill the opening left by Justice Phil Johnson of Amarillo, who retired at the end of December.

Busby is a former justice of the Fourteenth Court of Appeals, having served from June 2012 through December 2018. He previously was a partner at Bracewell & Giuliani LLP, an adjunct professor at The University of Texas School of Law and a U.S. Supreme Court law clerk.

New lawmaker sworn in

State. Rep. Christina Morales, D-Houston, was administered the oath of office on March 17.

Morales won a March 5 special election runoff to fill the vacancy created when former longtime Texas House District 145 Rep. Carol Alvarado was elected to the Texas Senate to succeed Sen. Sylvia Garcia, who was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in November.

She attended Friona schools until she was about 15. It was important to her to keep up with the news and happenings of her hometown. She was a longtime subscriber of the Friona Star newspaper.





Registro propuesto No. 77585L019 de permiso estándar de calidad de aire para plantas de lotes de concreto

Solicitud. Hereford Concrete, Inc., ha solicitado a la Comisión de Calidad Ambiental del Estado de Texas (TCEQ por sus siglas en inglés) un Permiso de Estándar de Calidad ATMOSFÉRICA, NÚM. De Registro 77585L019, el cual autoriza la construcción de una Planta de Lotes de Concreto ubicada en 1380 Highway 214, Friona, Parmer Condado, Texas 79035. Este enlace a un mapa electrónico de la ubicación general del sitio o de la instalación es proporcionado como una cortesía y no es parte de la solicitud o del aviso. La planta que se propone emitirá los siguientes contaminantes atmosféricos: material particulado incluyendo (pero no limitado a) agregados, cemento, polvo de caminos y partículas menores a 10 micrómetros de diámetro y menores a 2.5 micrómetros de diámetro.

Esta solicitud se presentó a TCEQ el February 21, 2019. El director ejecutivo de la TCEQ ha concluido las revisiones técnicas y administrativas de la solicitud y ha determinado que la solicitud reúne todos los requisitos de un permiso estándar autorizado por 30 TAC § 116.611 (Título 30 del Código Administrativo de Texas, Sección 116.611), lo cual establecería las condiciones bajo las cuales la planta debe operar. El director ejecutivo ha concluido la decisión preliminar de otorgar el registro porque reúne todas las normas relevantes. La solicitud del permiso, la decisión preliminar del director ejecutivo, y el permiso estándar, estarán disponibles para ser revisados y copiados en la Oficina Central de la TCEQ, en la Oficina Regional de Amarillo de la TCEQ, y en la Friona Public Library, 109 West 7th Street, Friona, Parmer County, Texas, empezando el primer día de la publicación de este aviso. Los archivos de cumplimiento de la ley de la instalación, si existen, están disponibles para la revisión del público en la Oficina Regional de Amarillo Regional Office, 3918 Canyon Drive, Amarillo, Texas de la TCEQ. Comentarios Públicos/Reunión Publica. Usted puede presentar comentarios públicos o una petición para reunión pública. Véase la sección de contactos. La TCEQ tomará en cuenta todos los comentarios públicos en la decisión final de la solicitud. La fecha límite para presentar comentarios públicos es 30 días después de que se publique el aviso en el periódico. Cuestiones tales como valor de la propiedad, ruido, seguridad de tráfico y zonificación no están dentro de la jurisdicción de la Comisión para abordarse en este proceso judicial.

El propósito de la reunión pública es proporcionar la oportunidad de hacer comentarios o preguntas acerca de la solicitud. Si el director ejecutivo determina que existe un importante grado de interés público con respecto a la solicitud o si lo solicita un legislador local, se llevará a cabo una reunión pública. Una reunión pública no es una audiencia de caso impugnado. Si se lleva a cabo una reunión pública, la fecha límite para entregar comentarios públicos se prolonga hasta el fin de la reunión pública.

Oportunidad para una audiencia de caso impugnado. Usted puede solicitar una audiencia de caso impugnado. El solicitante o el director ejecutivo pueden pedir que la solicitud sea remitida directamente a una audiencia de caso impugnado después de la revisión técnica. La fecha límite para presentar audiencia de caso impugnado es 30 días después de que se publique el aviso en el periódico. Una audiencia de caso impugnado es un procedimiento legal similar a un juicio civil en un tribunal de distrito del estado. A menos que se presente una solicitud para una audiencia de caso impugnado dentro de 30 días de esta notificación, el director ejecutivo puede autorizar la solicitud. Si no se recibe una solicitud para audiencia dentro del período de 30 días, no se dará otra oportunidad para audiencia. Si una solicitud para una audiencia es recibida dentro del plazo de 30 días, entonces el período para solicitar una audiencia de caso impugnado sea prolongado a 30 días después del envío por correo de la respuesta a comentarios del director ejecutivo.

Una persona que pueda ser afectada por las emisiones de contaminantes atmosféricas de la instalación tiene el derecho de solicitar una audiencia. Para solicitar una audiencia de caso impugnado, una persona debe vivir actualmente en una residencia permanente dentro de 440 yardas de la instalación propuesta. Para solicitar una audiencia de caso impugnado, usted deberá proporcionar lo siguiente: (1) su nombre (o para un grupo o asociación, un representante oficial), dirección y número de teléfono; (2) el nombre del solicitante y número del permiso; (3) la declaración "[yo/nosotros] solicito/solicitamos una audiencia de caso impugnado"; (4) una descripción específica de cómo se vería afectado negativamente por la solicitud y las emisiones atmosféricas de la planta de manera que no es común para el público en general; (5) la ubicación y la distancia de su propiedad con relación a la planta; y (6) una descripción de cómo usa la propiedad que pueda ser afectada por la planta; y (7) una lista de todas las cuestiones de hecho en disputa que usted presenta durante el período de comentarios. Si la petición la hace un grupo o asociación, uno o más miembros que tienen derecho a solicitar una audiencia deben ser identificados por su nombre y dirección física. Los intereses que el grupo o la asociación busca proteger también se deben identificar. También puede presentar sus modificaciones propuestas a la solicitud que satisfarían sus inquietudes. Véase la sección de contactos.

Acción de la TCEQ. Después del plazo final para comentarios públicos, el director ejecutivo tomará en cuenta los comentarios y preparará una respuesta para todos los comentarios públicos pertinentes y materiales, o significativos. Si no se recibe una petición oportuna para una audiencia de caso impugnado, o si todas las solicitudes para una audiencia son retiradas, el director ejecutivo puede emitir la aprobación final de la solicitud. Si todas las solicitudes oportunas no son retiradas, el director ejecutivo no emitirá la aprobación final del permiso y enviará la solicitud y las peticiones a los Comisionados para su consideración en una reunión programada de la comisión. La Comisión solo puede conceder una solicitud para una audiencia de caso impugnado sobre asuntos que el solicitante entregó en sus comentarios oportunos que no fueron remitidos posteriormente. Si se concede una audiencia, el tema de la audiencia estará limitado a cuestiones de hecho en disputa o preguntas mixtos de hechos y ley relacionados a preocupaciones pertinentes y materiales de calidad de aire entregado durante el período de comentarios. Cuestiones tales como valor de la propiedad, ruido, seguridad de tráfico y zonificación no están dentro de la jurisdicción de la Comisión para abordarse en este proceso judicial.


