## City Council hears from local students

The Friona City Council met in regular session on Wednesday, April 10th at 6:30 p.m. in the City Coun-
cil Chambers at 619 Main in Friona, Texas. The meeting began with a roll call, an in vocation, and the Pledge of Allegiance.
The Council heard a presentation from members of the Friona Junior High ing cross walks and traffic signage It was deemed that more research was needed before any action could be taken. The Council thanked the students for their presentation and their interest in the community.
During the public comments period, new Atmos Energy representative Mike Gonzalez introduced him self to the Council. Next, Mayor Ricky White issued Nomation ed certificates to the Frion Public Library and Friend of the Library.
Ricky Barnett, head of the Bond Steering Committee made a presentation to the Council regarding the up coming bond election on May 4th. He discussed details of the proposed construction project for each school campus and what effects the bond passage would have on the taxpayers. Next, approval was given
to establish a Visitor Impact to establish a Visitor Impact ed defining the scope of the work to be done and outlin ing membership guidelines
for the Commission. Debra (Cooper) Campbell gave a report to the Council concerning a block grant available to purchase fire ambulance, and service trucks. The grant will pay up to $\$ 500,000$ for the purchase of new vehicles only. The cost to the City would only be a $\$ 5000$ buy in. Deb ra told the Council that the Friona Volunteer Fire DeEngine 1, and that they also needed a new attack truck. quote for $\$ 450,000$ had been quote for $\$ 450,000$ had been ment. A survey would have to be performed before the grant could be submitted to make sure that Friona would meet the middle-to-low in come wage requirements.

The Council gave approval authorizing the grant appli cation.
The Council heard from Noemi Perez concerning the utility bill for the Walnut Park Apartments (formerly Cotenwood). Noemi is the new manager of the prop erty that is owned by KN Properties. Discussion cen tered around the new wate me possible software glitch concerning the billing Both parties agreed to proceed with average monthly bill ing using prior water usage during the past year until the software problem could be resolved.
In other business, the Council approved the Ac counts Payable and Finan
cial Statement for Marc 2019. The Council also approved the lst quarte (January thru March 2019) financial statement and the Minutes of the March 11 2019 meeting. Also, approval was given to the annual review of the City's investmen policy and the Council heard a report from the Friona Po lice Department.

gave them the task to design a prosthetic finger Masse, Towner, and the students videos to get a grasp of what would be needed to make the new digit work. Masse also pointed out that one man had used bicycle parts to build a prosthetic finger. The students creating the first renditions were Manuel Castaneda, Ji, Samuel Chihuahua, Erika Grado, Fabian LedezmaGonzalez, Verenice Mendoza, Raul Silva and Taylor Stallings. After many trials and errors, their renditions of the sumitted ger. Towner combined the students renditions and used the best of the designs.It wasn't until the second semester be gan that actual measurements were taken and fabrication began. Students Bryan Arzate, Austin Mercado and Jason Kelley were assigned to do the measurements. The mea surements were made with a caliper. Every step of building the finger had to be measured and re-measured before being taken for every socket top and bottom, and length from tip to base and the linkage length. "We saw a nub and started measuring it," stated Kelley The finger was printed in red PLA (polyactic acid) plastic and Black Ninja Flex. The PLA material takes the place of what would be bones in a normal finger. The Ninja Flex material would take the place of softer structures in a finger (fat and muscles). It would also who would come in contact with it giving a more realistic touch Both colors where cho sen to represent the Friona Chieftains and Squaws. "We put it all together with Google Sketchup" stated student Tay lor Stallings. The first finger was rejected due to it being too
long. Adjustments were mad and a finger of suitable length was printed and trying to mak sure the knuckles would line The next issue to conquer was getting the finger to move and flex. Inside the finger is an elastic band which pulls the finger straight and fishing line allows it to bend when the fin ger moves. The fishing line was attached to a plastic stick that stretches along the back if the hand and is attached to a piece of yarn tied around Masse' wrist to insure movement. The piece of yanrote be replace, choosing Masse's muscles in his hand had begun to atrophy ho the new finger will medical ly help ease the atrophy. ## Up From The Grave...

There is something profoundly special about the rere reading this on Thursday as many of you might, esus according to Scripture is intently focused on carrying out the will of His Father. By Thursday evening Jesus is reclining at a table sharing the Passover meal with is disciples. Several things will happen in the course of this Passover meal and the days o follow. Abbott, Patrick and Bonnen also pushed lawmakers to pass legislation that would allow Texans to vote to offset local property tax revenue by increasing local sales taxes by a penny.

The last day to submit your Market Facilitation Program (MFP) application was Feb. 14, 2019. The final day to certify 2018 production is May 1, 2019.
