# NOTICE To Car Owners 

## With Out－of－State Registrations

Out of State car owners are requested to transter their car tiites，and register their cars early to avoid the deadline of April 1．1952．It is necessary that all out of state registered cars surrender their present titles and make application for Texas tilles before they can register their cars in Texas for 1952.

Due to the length of time it takes to make the necessary trans－ fer on an out of state vehicle，it will necessitate a delay and a possible penalty to the owner should he wait up until the deadine to perfect his title．

Ouf of state vehicles owners should bring the necessary pa－ pers to the Tax Collector＇s Office in Rankin as these trans－ fers can only be pericied in this office．
Register early and avoid delay later．
