





#### Pecos River Stocked Wih San Angelo Fish

September 26, approximately 10,-000 young fish were roosed in the Pecos River, both at the Farm Crossing and Iraan Crossing. Of this figure, according to N. W. Johnson, game warden, 2,000 were fingerling bass, 3 to 6 inches in length. There were 1,000 bluegill, 2.000 red ear, 1,000 green sunfish, 3,000 yellow breasted sunfish and 1.000 assorted fish from seven sunfish classifications.

Johnson also stated that a like amount had been released at Sheffield by the Texas Game, Fish and Oyster Commission. The stockers came from the San Angelo hatchery.
