 COURT RULES ESSENTIAL TO JUSTICE
What about court rules-the pro
cedural rules governing legal cedural rules governing legal
trials? Are they tools of delay or
instrumen instruments of justice? Procedure
is the lubricant which makes the is the lubricant which makes the
machinery of uniform justice run smoothly. Far from being of con-
cern only to cern only to lawyers and judges,
rules of procedure are of real sig. rules of procedure are of real sig.
nificance to all of us. The law is composed
The law is composed of two
parts-the substantive and the ad-
jective law. The substantive law jective law. The substantive law
defines rights, duties and remedies; it enforces contracts and rights
wrongs; it describes crimes and wrongs; it describes crimes and
sets up penalities. Adjective law
deals with legal procedure and deals with legal procedure and
describes the steps a person must take to invoke the substantive
law. Some of our most importan
rights are to be found in the body of procedural law. For example, as a people who want justice to
prevail, we like to think that ev ery man, rich or poor, shall have
his day in court hey man, rich or poor, shall have
his day in court. This is an impor-
tant right, for tant right, for a day in court Im-
plies more than merely the rim plies more than merely the right
to have your say before a judge o have your say before a judge
and jury. Your day in court implies that
you shall have the right to be properly represented, ro have your
case presented befor case presented before an impartial
jury and on unbiased judge, and to have a reasonababed judge time, and
pare for the trial. It holds that
you shall New Jersey is the only state
which elects its governor for term of three years. Finally, the law governing pro cedure tells you how you may ap-
peal your case to higher courts when your case to higher court
had a fair trial or thou have not a prejud had a fair trial or that a prejudi
cial error has been committed in
the trial the trial court.
Much of our procedural law
comes down from centuries of experience in the courts of other
lands. It was lands. It was inevitable that
through the centuries through the centuries some of the
procedure would become cumberprocedure would become cumber.
some, obsolete and difficult. For
this reason the hist this reason the history of proced-
ure has been characterized are has been characterized by great
periods of retorm. In America we
have experiened have experienced many advan
tageous changes in mer tageous changes in our laws gov-
erning the procedure of courts and administrative agencies. There is
a growing custom in the United a growing custom in the United
States of giving the courts the Sates of giving the courts the
power to revise rules in certain Our Texas rules of civil pro-
cedure are made by our State Su preme are made by our State while the rules of
criminal procedure are criminal procedure are under the
direct control of the Legislature.
Both Both the court and the Legislature are constantly striving, with the recommendations of the practic-
ing lawyer, to improve these rules Their aim is to provide uniform
and relatively simple rules for the dispensing of justice with a
minimum of delay minimum of delay. you shall have proper notice of
the action against you; that the complaint or indictment shall state
clear cause of action. It means you shall be confronted by your ac-
