tory. Frank Dobie places the naming of it clear back to Spanish
Conquistadores' day, but the most likely version is that John R. Bart-
left named it in 1850 when he was surveying the Mexican boundary. He found the crossing marked by
the skulls of horses. John $S$. Ford camped there a year earlier
(1949) while scoun Le949) while scouting out a fast
corty-niner route from San An tonio to El Paso and points west. "The Handbook of Texas" points skeletons of horses and mules clutlering both sides of the river. These remains, it is believed, were a crop ed in Old Mexico by the light of the Comanche moon. Since the nearest watering toward Chihua-
hua was 60 miles to the southwest hua was 60 miles to the southwest (Comanche Springs), the ride to
the Pecos half killed them, with the acrid Pecos water, doubtless. taking care of the other half.
