## New Law Puts Stiff Fines On Liquor At Game

It will cost anyone caught with intoxicating beverages in their possession on the football field this season.
A new law passed by the Legislaure states in part: "It shall be unlawful for any person or person o bring or carry into any enclosure field or stadium, where athletic events, sponsored or participated in by the public schools of this Stat are being held, any intoxicating beverages or to have any intoxicating beverages in his possession while in or on said enclosure, field or stadium."
The law provided that the penalty shall be a fine of not less than $\$ 25$ or not more than $\$ 200$.
In a letter to Superintendents of Schools in Upton County, Stev Preslar, county attorney, has point ed out that this is a new law and one that should be called to everyones attention. He further pointed out that a person does not have to be drinking to be subject to fine Just having it in his possession either on his person or in his car will be a violation. He also stressec that "within the enclosure" means that it cannot be taken past the gate and that this applies to cars driven into the enclosure past the point where tickets are being taken Sheriff Gene Eckols has asked that everyone comply with the new law and warns thate to apprehend those in violation.
