As extra precaution against loss, Postmaster Roach advised placing both your return address and the recipient's address inside the carton or package before it is wrapped.

Don't seal your parcel unless you include a notice reading "Contents merchandise-may be opened for postal inspection" along with your return address and the recipient's address on the mailing label. If you use Christmas stickers or seals put them on the back of your Christmas cards and packages so that they will not conflict with the address on the front. Before you release your packages be sure that proper postage is firmly affixed to each.






