## RE-ALLOCATION ELECTION ON COUNTY FUNDS WILL BE HELD SATURDAY 14

In their first county-wide election of the year, Upton voters will go to the polls once again Saturday, April 14, and vote on re-allocation of county funds.
This election, which is merely a legal procedure that must be followed every six years, will give the tax payers their chance to approve the division of tax money into certain operating funds. Called by the Commissioners' Court, the approval of the re-allocation of funds would see 45 cents of the tax money going into the general fund, 10 cents for road and bridges, 25 cents for permanent improvements, No additional money would be put into the jury fund since this account has a rather large surplus at this time.

Wo:kmen were beginning the moving of fences and clearing of right-cf-way along the road leading to the Shell Pipeline Camp early this wzek.
Plans called for in the project being carried out by the commissioners' court specify that the road will be widened two feet on each side with a new seal coating covering the new and old parts of the highway. Right-of-way will be widened 25 feet on each side giving a total of 100 feet for approximately the first two miles after leaving the Midland highway.
