RASH OF THEFTS DEVELOP IN CITY

Some thieves with a heavy thirst, a desire for transportation and a yearn for nick-nacks had a rather busy week in Rankin with two break-ins and a stolen car reported.

First place to be hit by burglars was Doc Adam's liquor store on Highway 67 which was tapped Tuesday night for 8 or 9 cases of whiswey and \$40 or \$50 in change. Entrance was gained by prying open the back door.

On Sunday afternoon at approximately 4:00 p.m., entry was made through the front door at the Rankin Drug Store. Hattie Mitchell. owner, reported the theft of some \$150 worth of merchandise, including a number of fountain pens, bill folds, expensive boxes of candy and miscellaneous items.






