Rankin's gas system, purchased a little more than a year ago, show. ed a net profit last year of \$5,724.87. Total receipts for gas sale amount_ ed to \$32,267.07. Tapping fees and transfers from other funds brought the total receipts by the gas sys. tem to \$33,644.02.

Expenses for the year in the gas system amounted to \$28,013.32 which included \$5,810.71 put into reserve and sinking funds and me. ter deposits and general funds. Ac. tual operating expense, including purchase of gas was \$22,202.61.

WATER SYSTEM PROFIT
