A letter of commendation was received this week by the Upton County Tax Assessor.Collector's off. ice for the efficient manner in which accounts have been handled over the past years.
Addressed to H. E. "Gene" Eckols, and dated August 2, it was from the Comptroller of Pubile Account's off ice in Austin and said in part
"We are pleased to enclose statement of your annual report for the year ending June 30, 1957 whish shows the account to be in balance. We are always glad to check an account (such as yours) where is has been so accurately kept...." The letter was signed by Robert S. Calvert, State Comptrol ler.
In addition to the letter from the state office, state auditors who recently checked the accounts of the county tax assessor-collector's office have said that it is one of the most efficiently operated offices of its kind in the state. As in the com. trollers report, all accounts balanc-
ed and no errors were found by the state auditors.
Annually, the county office handl. es tax and other monies in the amounts of approximately one mil. lion dollars.
At the beginning of the tax year, state accountants set up $\mathbf{\$ 7 5 4 , 7 4 2 . 5 3}$ for which the local office was to col lect and account. When the transac. tions were completed and the rec. ords checked, it was found that every penny of this amount was on hand and properly accounted for. Auditors who had been in such work for a number of years, said that they could never remember a case before when there wasn't at least a few cents that was "out of place.
In tax collections for the past year, the office had an outstanding record of 101 percent of collections. The over 100 percent figure was a result of penalty and interest charges on some accounts.

Now we are engaged in a great long form, testing whether that taxpayers, or any other taxpayer so confused and so fusterated, can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that struggle. We have come to dedicate a portion of our income to the great causes, useless and foolish, which have taken our money that this Nation might con. tinue to support other nations.
And yet, in a larger sense, we cannot affort, we have not got, we will not have, this hallowed money. For the grave taxpayers, broke and penniless, who paid here, have de. dicated it far above our poor power to add, subtract, multiply, divide, refer to separate schedule $Z$, etc.
