In countries where the Press has been chained, there was first a period when it failed to realize and resist the beginnings of its end - the first encroachments on its freedom. Here in America there is only the limitation of national security - the necessity to protect and preserve confidential military and scientific information - which can be accepted by a Press that is determined to stay free.
America's newspapers have made, and will continue to make, a conscientious effort to protect that security - at the same time keep. ing the people informed as fully as possible on all matters concerning their welfare. So long as American newspapers pursue that policy fearlessly, our Press, our people and our country shall remain free of tyranny.
