 CONFUSING SOMEWHAT-Last week The Rankin News had an article stating that local ranchers were thinking about doing a bit of spraying on mesquite trees on their ranchland and that the Federal Government has a plan whereby they will pay half of the cost.
Object of this program being to help the ranchers produce more in the way of wool and meat from less land.
Now if I was in the ranching business and decided to spray my mescuite trees, I would take advantage of this offer by the boys in Washington to pay half of the expense. More than likely-just about anyone else would, two.
This seems like a sensible program and one that would be of benefit for the rancher and everyone else concerned since the more that is produced, the more there is avallable for sale and this-in an ordinary situation-would eventually result in cheaper prices due to the old law of supply and demand.
But there is a strange aspect to the whole thing. While trying to help the rancher produce, the same Federal Government has another program that pays farmers not to produce. This same program also pays out a lot of tax payers money each year to buy up surplusesto keep the price high.
Seem confusing? Don't go away there's still more.
Should one of the ranchers have a farm on which he raised-say, wheat-to feed his livestock and make them produce more - the government would tell him that he could plant only so much-not all, perhaps, that he would need-just perhaps, that he w
an allotted amount.
And if he planted more than his allotment to feed his livestock to help produce more, he would be subject to a heavy fine. Yet, we have the mesquite-spraying allotment for the same reason.
