And speaking of labels-read the egg carton. Texas Egg Law requires that the cartons give quality of eggs, weight, and name of packer. No egg can be labeled fresh unless it is at least grade $\mathbf{A}$ or better.
Grades start with AA. then A and on down to $B$ and C. Weights are given in size-Jumbo for the Largest, Extra Large, Large, Medium Small and Peewees each must meet a certain standard of weight per dozen.
And don't forget to take care of the eggs. Remember that a grade AA won't stay that way for long if they remain in the carton at room temperatures
