## FACTS ABOUT TEXAS PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Texas public schools enrolled $1,309,415$ students and employed 50,330 teachers in 1948-49.

Texas public schools enrolled 2,129,967 students and employed 88,050 teachers in 1960-61.

By 1965 Texas will need 104,000 teachers for an anticipated student enrollment of $2,450,000$.

Since 1952, enrollment has increased annually at the rate of about 80,000 students and will continue at this rate for the next six years.
Almost half $(38,000)$ of the teachers in Texas public schools have taught 13 or more years.
More than $\mathbf{1 5 , 0 0 0}$ teachers have taught 26 years or more.
Texas ranks 34th among the 50 states in average salary paid teachers.
The beginning minimum salary for a teacher with a degree in Texas is $\mathbf{\$ 3 , 2 0 4}$.
The national average spent per child during $1960-61$ is $\$ 390$.
Texas is pending $\$ 330$ per child in 1960-61, which ranks 35 th among the $\mathbf{5 0}$ states.
rexas spent 3.12 per cent of its income for public schools in 1958-59 and ranked 27 th in this respect.
n the last 10 years the local districts of Texas have spent more than one billion dollars in schoolhouse construction. exas today has 1,531 school districts; in 1948-49 it had 4,474 districts.
Thirty-two Texas counties operate county-wide school districts.

## HOSPITAL AUXILIARY TAKES OVER BLOOD BANK FILES

The first duty of the newly or-
ganized Hospital Auxiliary ganized Hospital Auxiliary was to take over the Blood Bank files at the Rankin Hospital and to bring them up to date. This job has just been completed and very few names were left in the file. It will be the work of the Auxiliary to keep this file active.
At the present time, there are a very small number of residents of Rankin and the surrcunding area who have their blood type on record in the Blood Bank file, which was started several years ago. Many people have moved away while other, for variour reasons, are unable to donate blood now.
One objextive of the Hospital Auxiliary is to maintain a complete record of all types of blood to meet any emergency at any time. Mr. Leon Feuge, the hospital administrator, has agreed to type, free of charge, for every-
one who would like to have their one who would like to have their blood typed and placed in the Blood Bank file at the hospital. Having all available types of blood on file will save a lot of time and possibly a life in case of an emergency.
A card will be filled out for you and one placed in the file. It is also a worthy suggestion to have your blood type on your identification sard and carried with you at all times-especially if you have one of the rare types.
