of increase in motor vehicles in Texas in the last four decades is twenty times the present increase in population. There are two Texans for every Texas-registered motor vehicle.

The Department stressed the importance of registering all automobiles and trucks in the county of the vehicle owner's residence. The penalty for operating a vehicle without home-county license plates is the same as operating one with no plates at all. Court fine can be as much as \$200 plus being required to register in the home county with a 20 percent penalty of the annual fee. Refunds cannot be granted for the illegal plates.

Owners registering illegally in 1961 can expect to face court charges according to the Texas Highway Department.

Positions as drawn from a hat were: 1. Dell Cooledege, 2. Gordon Steele, 3. Arvil Gryder, 4. D. L. Trowbridge, 5. Horace West, 6. J. D. Gossett, 7. C. J. Shaffer, and 8. C. L. Miller.

Absentee voting opened at the County Clerk's office in the court house today, March 9. Any qualified voter who will be out of the

district on April 1 or who will be otherwise physically unable to go to the polls on that date, may cast an absentee ballot with the clerk by filling out the required forms. Absentee balloting will continue until three full days before the April 1 election.

For the city, J. W. Kennedy was

the only candidate filing for the councilman seat. He will be seeking his first elective term. Voting in this election will be on April 4 and absentee voting will open at the clerk's office next Tuesday. Absentee voting in the state senatorial race will also begin on that date.

Red Devil Band Takes A First-Place Trophy in Brady

Rankin High School's Red Devil Band entered the Brandy Band Festival last Saturday and walked off with a first division in sight reading and were edged out of a similar honor for concert playing by the Albany High School Band.

Rankin's was the largest group in numbers in Class A competition and were highly regarded in the contest.

This was their second appearance in the Brady event, and their second time to win a top trophy there.

4-H Club Sets Sale Record

After seeking the high ground in stock show competition for most of the current season, the Upton County 4-H Club reached the top of the mountain in Houston last week, taking five out of seven first places in the various classes and having the grand champion lamb of the show. The Houston Show had long been a tough one for the local club and this was their first time to crack the championship barrier.

But then the food came and before it ended with the sales last week-end, the Upton County 4-H Club had established their biggest money show in their history with total sales in excess of \$5,500. Leading the way was Virginia Herral's grand champion which rang up \$2,500 in the till. Sonny Allen's reserve brought \$1,000 and the other winners contributed a substantial amount in prize money.

"It was a long way to the winners circle this year," County Agent Dub Day said, "but it looks like it was worth it and I'm particularly proud of the members of the club for their showing in this show—the one we had never won".

This week the club is in San Angelo for the show.

Safety Tips Offered By Utilities Co. Manager

Local children were cautioned today against flying kites near electric wires by Fred Welling, local manager for West Texas Utilities Company.

He suggested an open field, away from electric wires and busy streets as an ideal place for kite-flying. "It is dangerous to fly kites in the streets or anywhere near poles and wires, partly because of traffic hazards and partly because kites may come in contact with electric lines," the WTU manager said.

"If a kite gets caught in electric wires, a child may receive an electrical shock, or at best may lose his kite," Welling warned. He emphasized, however, that kite-

flying can be completely safe if a few simple rules are followed.

The WTU manager made his plea for safety as warm temperatures and steady breezes signalled the beginning of the spring kite-flying season.

"If a kite does become caught in the wires, don't try to get it down. Either leave it alone, or call the WTU office for assistance," he suggested.

In discussing electrical safety, the power company spokesman also urged parents to use care when they are moving outside television or radio antennas without expert help. He pointed out that WTU servicemen would be glad to advise them concerning high voltage lines near their homes.

DOES "WELFARE" MAKE CHIME?—

Is there any connection between welfare and crime? A lot of people are asking that question in one form or another. But nobody can give a definite answer because nobody has made an objective study of the subject.

Sometimes the question is asked differently—for example: What effect does welfare have on the character of the American people? Here again, a definite answer can not be given. But perhaps we can get an inkling from certain revealing facts, of what the answer might be.

The "welfare" referred to, of course, means outright government handouts to individual citizens. These handouts may seem to come from generous and benevolent governments, federal, state, and local—but in reality they come from self-reliant and energetic Americans who work hard for salaries, wages, etc. The government then step in, tax the results of their labor and use part of these taxes to make the handouts.

Now the last 20 years in these United States, have been years of boom and prosperity. They have been, of course, periods of recession, but generally speaking anybody who really wanted a job could get one. But evidently there is a growing segment of our population who would rather live off the earnings of others. That may seem like a harsh and cold-hearted statement. But the Tax Foundation recently made a study of welfare payments in the United States which reveals some shocking figures. We must keep in mind two things about these figures.

The first is that they refer to a period of great prosperity.

The second is they include only outright handouts—what we used to call doles. They do not include social security payments or payments under any other government insurance schemes. They refer only to what goes under the fancy

name of "public assistance"—which means, as we said, plain doles.

Well, in the last 20 years—years of raging prosperity—this outright welfare spending by the federal government has risen 685 percent!

In the case of state and local governments, it has risen 117 percent!

These incredible figures mean that there are nearly SEVEN MILLION AMERICANS living on outright doles from the government.

Undoubtedly, some of these people cannot help themselves. But how many of these people have fallen for the vicious notion that the government owes everybody a living? Why Work? Why not just sit back and let the government take care of you? This is what is meant when someone asks what effect welfare is having on the character of the American people.

There was a time when the American was the most independent, self-reliant individual in the world. He considered it a major ingredient of his own moral integrity to earn his own way if he possibly could. What, then, are we to think when SEVEN MILLION AMERICANS—in a period when in many spots jobs were going begging—were willing to accept government handouts at the expense of their fellow working citizens?

As to whether all this has anything to do with crime, it would be interesting to know if there is any connection between these figures and a recent statement by J. Edgar Hoover of the FBI. Mr. Hoover made the startling revelation that crime in the United States is at an all-time high. He said that last year there were more than 1,500,000 serious offenses committed throughout the nation. And this cannot be blamed on the increase in our population because, as Mr. Hoover pointed out, crime has risen FOUR times as fast as the population.

It would be of great value if we could determine if there is any connection between Mr. Hoover's alarming figures on the increase

in crime and those of the Tax Foundation on the fantastic rise in welfare handouts. Certainly any sensible person can see that once any major portion of a nation's people get the notion that somebody else owes them a living, the next step is easy. Go out and help yourself—at gun—or knife-point if necessary—to anything you want.

A constitutional amendment (H.J.R. #4) is being considered whereby Texans will be given an opportunity to legalize horse race betting in Dallas, Tarrant, Harris, Galveston, Bexar, Midland, Hidalgo, Cameron and Webb Counties, subject to approval by LOCAL OPTION.

H.J.R. #4 provides for distribution, ANNUALLY, among all counties that do not have race tracks, one-half of the STATE TAX REVENUE obtained from horse racing. Each county would receive approximately \$1.00 per capita population the first year. Counties where the tracks are located would receive 2% of parimutuel handle. The state's tax income from horse racing alone would run close to \$12,000,000 the very first year—possibly more—besides all the income tourists would bring to Texas—which would amount to millions of dollars, plus a great ad valorem tax on race tracks, breeding farms and many valuable race horses.
