For years now, first one and then another have punched holes into the ground around Rankin and come up with dry holes until it was getting to the point where you couldn't find a new place to drill. Then along came the Blue Danube Oil Company, scrapped off a spot among the dry holes just a piece out of town, and got for themselves a duel-completion well.

Next, a well was drilled across from the Western Company and they put a gas well into their pocket. Now the north offset to the Blue Danube appears to be in the process of making a fair well in the Ellenburger and two more locations are being readied for drilling. A west offset to the discovery well was under construction this week and Blue Danube will start an east off-set in the next few days.

All of a sudden, we're right in the middle of what must be a hot spot for oil and if it proves to be just that, it will put truth into what old timers have long said: that Rankin is located right on top of one of the best oil fields in the county.

Time will tell.

LOOK FOR THESE-

Among the new things on the market or coming soon are ham cans that are easier to open—without leaving the sharp edge. Watch for them, they're due in December.

Frozen juice, fruit and vegetable packages are coming out with a tear strip for opening.

Commercially frozen fruits and vegetables are coming out in one

to two pound polyethelene bags. You'll be able to pour out food as needed, reclose it, and store.

More ingredient foods will be on the market in recipe size packages, such as nuts and shredded cheese.

Among the new products are new cake mixes, a new mix for scones, pancakes, biscuits, muffins, etc.; and a prepared zucchine and Souerkraut.

With all the new ready prepared products and convenient packaging, we'll need to check even more carefully on the food dollar to decide if we are buying mainly food or service—fine either way, just so we know what we are doing!. However, we can't always assume that ready prepared foods are more expensive. For example, we find that graham cracker crumbs already prepared are cheaper than an equal weight of the whole crackers. It pays to read labels!

MAN'S LOVE FOR GOD

"For this is the love of God that we keep His commandments: and His commandments are not grievous" (I John 5:3).


The above statement is the rule by which to tell whether or not one loves the Lord—he cannot tell by his feelings. If one says, "Let all who love the Lord stand up," as has been so often done, many rise who are known not to have kept the Lord's commandments. "He that saith, 'I know God,' and keepeth not His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him" (I John 2:4). Do you want to know whether or not you really love the Lord? Then apply the "acid test." Jesus said, "If ye love me, ye will keep my commandments." (John 14:15) He also said, "Ye are my friends, if ve do the things I command you" (John 15:14).

Those who love the Lord do not classify His commandments as "essential" and "non-essential." They regard the least commandment as a test of their love for God, and keep it. They are con-

cerned about: "What does the Lord require of me?" For the answer to such a question, they search the scriptures-the Bible. This study necessitates the proper division of the word. To illustrate: God's command to Abraham to "offer up Isaac" is not part of our duty. The duties of the Levites in the tabernacle and temple are obligations of no one today. The law of Moses is not the law of Christ. God said, "This is my beloved Son; hear ye Him." (Matt. 17:5). We prove our love for Christ by keeping His commandments and not by keeping the law of Moses.

SW Animal Health Research Foundation Formed in Texas

BY W. M. DAY, Jr. County Agent, Upton County

Our survey of the migration and incidence of the screwworm fly is nearing the end of its second year. Information gained through this survey to date will be extremely valuable to any future screwworm control project. It is important that this survey be continued not only until that date, but must also be very dilligently carried on during any control project. Otherwise, we will not know where the insect is prevalent at the beginning nor the results of our efforts during such a program.

A control project in Texas will cost millions of dollars, but, if successful, will result in tremendous annual saving to the livestock industry. The expenditure of any sum of money, however, would be in vain without the continued cooperative support of the livestock owners. Therefore, your continued cooperation in the survey program is urgently needed.

At this date screwworms are still active in all parts of Texas. Soon the winterkill will begin in those counties fartherest north and proceed south as winter progresses, until only a comparative few counties will be infested in South Texas during late winter. This is one of the most vital seasons relative to our survey. We need to ascertain when the problem is eliminated in each county by the change of weather conditions or in which counties the fly is able to remain active throughout the year. This can be accomplished only by the continued receipt of screwworm samples from

Another vital season for our survey extends from late winter through the spring months, at which time the fly migrates from south to north causing crewworm infestation in all parts of Texas again. We also request samples during the months of constant infestation in order to remain informed as to the severity of the problem and the percentage infestation in each county.

Screwworm control program for Texas is headed by Mr. T. A. Kincaid of Ozona and Marvin J. Bridges of Buffalo, trustees of the Southwest Animal Health Research Foundation, met with officials of the Texas Education Agency and the A&M College of Texas to discuss plans for combatting multi-million dollar annual losses to the livestock industry in Texas. Purpose of the Foundation is to receive and disburse funds and to foster research and educational programs in animal health.

First on the agenda is a statewide program to control screw worms, Kincaid said. He pointed out that losses from this pest alone amount to some \$50 million each year. The organization will employ the sterile fly technique developed by USDA scientists and proved effective by Florida cattlemen.
