L. Porter Johnsons have announced that their big July Clearance Sale is still on.





# New "TELSTAR" relays phone calls and TV pictures for first time!

Bell System microwave-in-sky satellite is latest communications triumph for America arising from telephone research

The world's first private enterprise communications satellite is now being used for dramatic experiments in relaying telephone calls and television internationally.

Its name: Telstar. It was launched from Cape Canaveral at Bell System expense by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

Telstar receives signals beamed to it from a ground station, amplifies them and transmits them to another station on the ground belowperhaps an ocean away from the first one. The new satellite thus acts as a microwave relay station in the sky, enabling voices, TV pictures and data messages to leap thousands of miles in a new and exciting way.

The ground stations in the U.S. now being used for Telstar were built by the Bell System at Andover, Maine, and Holmdel, New Jersey.

Telstar is a first major experimental step toward a worldwide satellite communications system that was first proposed as a practical venture at Bell Telephone Laboratories. Progress toward such a system would not have reached its present state without continuing research and development by the private communications industry.

Above all else, Telstar is the latest achievement in an unending Bell System quest—the search for ways to make your telephone service still better, more economical, and more useful.

#### Satellite Will Benefit Rankin Residents

A small statellite hundreds of miles in outer space is sending signals to earth in tests that will lead to better communications services for Rankin residents.

The satellite, Telstar, is the Bell Telephone System's pioneer in the new frontier of space communications. Telstar tests will help pave the way for a worldwide satellite communications network to send overseas phone calls, live television and other signals. The satellites will receive and retransmit signals, much as overland microwave systems do in today's long distance calling.

Telstar was successfully launched from Cape Canaveral by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration which is co-operating with the Bell System in the experiments. The Bell System will repay NASA for the Telstar launching costs, about \$3 million.

Rankin television viewers will have opportuity to see Telstar's work first hand in a series of live telecasts planned between this country and Europe. Television signals will be sent from ground stations in England and Prance to Telstar and retransmitted to the Bell System's ground station at Andover, Maine. American programs will also be sent to Europe via Telstar.

Live overseas telecasts have not been possible up to now because ocean cable and radio systems in use don't have the transmission papacity for the signals.

Major experiments involve sending signals from the main ground station to another Bell Station at

Holmdel, New Jersey, via the satellite. Telephone calls, video tape signals, facsimile news photographs and high-speed data signals are being transmitted in these

In addition to communications transmission, Telstar gathers tech nical information on outer space as it orbits the earth at altitudes up to 3,500 miles. These findings will be shared with scientists throughout the world to help advance the peaceful use of space.

#### **Upton County Sends** Seven To NTSU

DENTON, JULY 21 - Upton County was represented by seven students at North Texas State Universit yin the school year just ended, the Registrar's Office has announced.

During the nine-month session, a total of 10,065 different students were enrolled. They came from 212 of the state's 254 counties, from 45 other states and from eleven foreign nations.

Texas higher education added 10.180 students last fall, and 1,-355 of these were at NTSU. The U. S. Office of Education reported a national enrollment increase of 7.8 per cent in the past year. North Texas gain was 18 per

Built by Bell Telephone Laboratories, Telstar is a 170-pound satellite, just under three feet in diameter. It carries more than 10,000 eleptronic parts and this gear amplifies signals 10 billion times for their return trip to earth.

A number of Bell Laboratories inventions, including the transistor and solar batteries, are essential to Telstar's operation. The small transistors make possible the satellite's complex curcuitry. Telstar is lined with 3,600 solar batteriy cells that convert sunlight into electricity for the satellite's power supply.



SATELLITE TALK—Telstar, the Bell Telephone System's first communications satellite, is now orbiting the earth at 16,000 miles per hour. White lines show how signals for phone calls, live television and other communications are sent from a ground station to the satellite and retransmitted to another earth station. Electronic gear on Telstar boosts signals 10 billion times for their return trip to earth. Telstar tests will help pave the way for a worldwide satellite communications system.
