Tax Savings Open On Investments

BY W. M. (DUB) DAY County Agent, Upton County INVESTMENT CREDITCongress enacted some new and for reaching tax provisions las October. Reference here is made to the investment credit feature of the 1962 Internal Revenue Code.
Investment credit is simply a reduction of tax liability by $7 \%$ of the amount of a taxpayer's investment which qualifies. One
major objective of this provision of the law is to stimulate the economy by encouraging moderni. zation of equipment and facilities.

The Internal Revenue Service has recently issued proposed regulations which clarify some of the questions that have been the qu farmers and ranchmen raised by farmers and ranchmen. The portion which deals with qualifying (or eligible) property is mentioned here insofar as these tentative regulations apply to assets often used by farm and ranch operators:
