In its regular meeting last Thursday evening, November 5, the Board of Trustees of the Rainkin Independent School Disteict accepted a bid for curbing and surfacing the track facility. The bid in the amount of \$13629.70 was submitted by wheeler and Workman Construction Co of Rankin.
Contractors plan to start work on the track by November 23 and 60 working days was estimated for conpletion of the job. The Board also accepted with regrets the resignation of Mrs. Clifford Wilson, effective at the end of this school semester, January 15, 1965. Mrs. Wilson is teaching a third grade section this year.
