It seems that on a certain date, said Louis Martenez, Jr. did take in hand one brick or rock and with aim good and true toss it through the window of the Security State Bank in McCameywithout the bank's permission, of course.
Results a: this first fing were so satisfactory that Martenez again took aim and crashed out a second window. It was pretty expensive throwing for the glass

As stated above, the reasoning for this action may not ever be known but its results are a mat ter of record for the grand jury charged Martenez with Malicious Destruttion of Private Property and ordered him held for trial.

Professional Touch
Professional home sewing can be achieved through know-how Cutting, marking, stay-stitching, and setting darts are the basic steps.
A new technique in cutting grainwise or directional cutting is being taught $4-\mathrm{H}$ beginners. The pattern is laid. pinned and checked, then cutting out is to follow with the grain. This makes a more prefessional cutting that keeps the grain line intact.
Markings may be made in many ways. $4-\mathrm{H}$ members find tracing paper and tracing whee's satis. factory. Notches are more accurate if snipped instead of cutting out or cutting in. Matching is easier.
