With a standing-room-only attendance on hand last Monday night at the City Hall, the Rankin City Council took the first steps in a process that could eventually lead to a Federal low rent housing project in Rankin. Tentatively, some 25 units consisting d' from two to four.bedroom brick homes would be constructed in Rankin. These might be built all in one area or they could be "scattered" anywhere in the city limits - or beyond by changing the boundries.

If constructed, these units would not necessarily be available for rent to the general public. In most such Federal housing projects, a renter could not have a total yearly income exceeding \$4200. Rents would be under \$50 per month for even the largest of the units and new legislation recantly enacted into law by the Congress would make it possible for the government to pay a part

or all of this rent under certain circumstances. Also to be paid for by the rental price would be water, sewer and gas bills. Telephone and electrical bills would be paid by the tenants.

These properties could also be available to rent by retired or e'derly persons. In this instance, the units must be located within walking distance of shopping areas.

Action on the proposal came a. bout when a representative of the Federal Housing Agency met last Thursday night with members of the City Council and interested citizens. He explained the steps that must be taken and how the program is operated. On Monday night, the Council met in session and listened for some 45 minutes to discussions of the plan by those present. It appeared that all who were on hand at the meeting were in favor of going ahead with the program as tentatively proposed. It was after hearing this group that the Council adopted a motion that they enter into an agreement with the Rankin Housing Auth. ority. The Rankin Housing Authority will be a board of five local residents appointed by the City Council. This board will be in full charge of the entire program and once they take over, no other local authority will be dealing with the Federal government on the work. A legal notice concerning this agreement appears in

this issue of the News. Other information relating to the proposition is on file at the City Hall and may be viewed by any inter. ested party.

There will now be a sixty-day waiting period-from September 30. first date of the publication. During this time, the public will be more fully informed of the plan and any who might oppose it will have opportunity to state their cause. At the end of the 60-day period, the Council will a. gain meet and consider taking the next step. If as many as 10 percent of the qualified voters of the City of Rankin should sign a petition in opposition to the project and present this petition to the City Council, then the Council might decide to call an election on the matter.

Should such an election be call. ed, it would deal solely with the question of whether or not Rankin should carry out a Federal low rent housing project. There would be no question of any bond issue. No debt obligation or repayment plan is made a part di this program as related to the City. All repayments are made from rentals of the unit and City of Rankin would not be responsible in case these payments were not met.



Rankin Seeking Upset of Strong Sonora Club

After scaring the feathers off the Big Lake Owls before going down 18-8 last Friday night, the Red Devils will try their hand at Bronch busting this week when they host the Sonora Bronchos in the Red Devil stadium. Kicko'f has been moved to the 7:30 time.


In the Big Lake game, the local squad treated the Owls to a quick six points via a pass that went between the hands of the Rankin defender but failed to let that dampen their spirits and came back with a couple of passes of their own that put them in the clubhouse at halftime with an 8-6 lead. That's when the

game should have been called off. Despite a slashing effort by the Rankin defense, Big Lake used their power to move the ball for what many consider the first "legal" touchdown scored against the Devils this year in that the opponents took the kick-off and never gave up the ball until they crossed the goal line. Rankin's offense also cratered in the second half, moving for only one first down. Later in the period, the Rankin squad spotted the Lakers another six points when a defender again missed blocking a pass that might well have been an interseption with a bit of luck.

Friday night, in the Sonora ball club, the Red Devils will be go. ing against a team that has allowed only 6 points in three outings. On offense, they have had an average of something like 30. They have good size, plenty of depth and a lot of experience. The roster contains fifteen boys who tip the scales at 160 or better with two tackles at 195 and 225. For the backfield, weights will range from 140 to 165 and average 155. They are reported to be capable passers and also have a strong ground game. In their meeting last year, a game which Sonora won 23-14,

Rankin City Council is to be commended for their actions in the housing program presently under study here. The council has not jumped into this matter without giving it any thought. In fact, they turned the entire idea down once balore but agreed to take another look at it at the request of interested parties. Al. though they have agreed to take the first steps in the process that may eventually result in low-rent housing for Rankin, they are still watching closely the entire development. I'd say that the best interests of the public are in good hands in this instance.

And what of the housing plan? There is as many questions as there are people who have an interest in the thing. Some of these questions can be answered through the rules and policies of the Federal Housing Authority. Some can be partially answered by taking from the experiences of other towns who have already gone into the project. Some can not be answered at all-at least not before the project is put into actual use here in Rankin. One of the big questions-and it is the major one that only time will clear up-is: will a low rent project solve the housing problems of Rankin and will it be of benefit to a majority of thepoep.

le? And you can get about any answer you want to that one. The fact is, there has never been nor will there likely ever be, any plan undertaken that does not have problems and question marks. These van, however, be met and solved if those with an interest in starting the work will maintain that interest and continue to give their time, efforts and thought to the administration of the program. It's like any other undertaking: it's not hard to find folk who say, sure, let's go but it sometimes get kinda difficult to locate all these supporters once the ball starts rolling.

He can't post a letter-an entire Federal show. If he has kids in school-out they come for there's no school that I know of-including private ones, that does not, in some way, be. nefit just a wee bit from Federal aid-direct or indirect.

We have chosen the subsidized route, in practically all things, and we may as well get about learning to live with it and to make it work to the best.

Rankin's housing program can do some good or it can be a folp. Federal aid or private enterpriseone gets out of it results in direct porportion to what he puts into it.

This column will support the housing project. It will not be an answer to all the housing problems in Rankin. There will be drawbacks as well as advantages; but, it will at least be an effort and may lead to still further such undertakings that over the years can pring a measure of progress.







timates of the quantities of the ground water that can be obtained on a perennial basis, and (4) the locations of those areas in the county that are most favorable for the development of additional ground-water supplies.

The U.S. Geological Survey has requested cooperation from land owners and well drillers when contacted in supplying information on wells in Upton County. Don White, USGS geologist, is conducting the field investigation. He will contact the owners and will visit wells for purposes of measuring water levels and yields, and collecting water samples. Samples from selected wells will be analyzed for mineral content, and copies of the analyses will be available from the laboratory upon the owner's request.

Grozier said that the results of the study will be presented in a published report that will be available to the public. The report will present data that can be used as a guide in developing the ground-water resources for maximum benefits for public supply, industrial, irrigation, domestic and stock requirements.
