

At any rate, voters are slated to make many trips to the polls in 1966. Elections that will be upcoming include the regular county, state and Federal office contests with two primaries and the general election, school

and city elections and almost definitely-for Upton County-at least one bond election. In addition, still more amendments to the state constitution will be decided before the end of '66.

On the county level, Commissioners in Precinct Two and Four, presently held by Tommy Workman in Rankin and Joe Conger in McCamey, will be running. Also,

the county judge, the county clerk, the county treasurer and all Justices of the Peace. In Rankin, these will be W. J. Price and Mrs. Montie (McSpadden) Cockerham.

In district races, it will be time for the District Judges to seek election-Upton County voters to cast ballots for two.

In the state races, Representatives will be up as will our state senator. This race holds promise of being one of extreme interest and will most likely feature the veteran Dorsey Hardeman and one-termer Pete Snelson and others. State offices will also be up for contest.

Another race that can be expected to highlight the year will be that for U. S. Senator in which the Democrats will try to unseat Republican John Tower

This one will be a no-holds barred affair that will not be settled until the November General Election.

In school elections, three seats will up for filling. These are presently held by Ed Edgar, Leon Houchins and the old pro of the Rankin School Board, A. B. Mc-

In the City Council race, voting will be for Mayor and one councilman. Presently, J. B. Pettit, Jr. holds the Mayor's seat and M. O. Price, the councilman chair.

One of the first votes to be taken in 1966 may be the proposed bond issue for improvements to Rankin & McCamey Hospitals. Petitions requesting this election have been in circulation for the past 60 days and there is good indication that the Commissioners Court may put the question to a vote as early as February.

For most of the officesin keeping with traditionfew candidates are expected to announce their intentions before January 1, 1966. As far as is known, in most of the paying jobs, the present office holders-from county to state-will seek re-election. At the same time, in the non-payment slots such as the school board and the city council (\$50 per month for Mayor and \$25 for the councilman) there is always a good slate from which the voter may select.

1966 looks very much like a bumper year for one of our national sports-politicking. It will be a good vear to keep the pencil sharp and the poll tax hanly provided you need a poll







Holiday Foods and Calorie Counting

The holidays usually spell disaster for most weight-watchers, because the abundance of good food makes it difficult to diet.

Dieters can enjoy holiday meals and not go too far astray if they will watch the calories they consume.

For example, if a weightwatcher eats a high-calorie food, he must watch his consumption of other high-calorie foods. Second helpings should be avoided. Many traditional holiday foods are not only delicious but also are low in calories.

Refer to the following listings of holiday foods for a calorie guide. The calorie count will vary somewhat due to the difference in recipes

Appetizers: Cranberry juice, 4 oz. glass-75; eggnog, 8 oz. glass-250; grapefruit juice, 4 oz. glass-45; cream of mushroom soup, 3/4 cup-105; tomato juice, 4 oz. blass 25; cream of tomato soup, 3/4 cup-150.

Salads and Dressings: Wal dorf salad, ½ cup-185; blue cheese dressing, 1 Tbsp.-75; ripe olives, (3)-30; cranberry sauce, 2 Tbsp-70; french dressing, 1 Tbsp.-60; mayonnaise, 1 Tbsp.-90.

Main Dishes: harvard beets ½ cup-120; buttered broccoli, ½ cup-40; giblet gravy, ½ cup-150; creamed onions, ½ cup-135; bread stuffing, ½ cup-200; chestnut or sausage stuffing, ½ cup-315; mushroof or rice stuffing, ½ cup-210; candied sweet potatoes, ½ cup-280; mashed sweet potatoes, ½ cup-150; turkey, white meat, 4 ozs.-195; turkey, dark meat, 4 ozs.-225.

Friday Balloting to Decide on Low Rent Procedure in Rankin

Voters in Rankin will go to the polls Friday and decide what they want the City Council to do about the proposed low rent housing project for Rankin. The question on the ballot puts forth the proposition of whether or not the City of Rankin is to enter into an agreement with the housing authority of Rankin.

Actually, the vote will amount to something like a straw vote in which the desires of the public will be expressed and will serve as a guidling for further actions by the City Council. If the measure as proposed on the ballot is approved, it will amount to a mandate to the City of Rankin to continue their efforts to secure Federally financed low rent housing. One of their first steps would likely be announcement of the selection of five local citizens who will comprise the City of Rankin Housing Authority. This organization would then take over the proposed proHgram and would continue its administration.

Polls will open at 8:00 a. m. Friday. Voting will continue until 7:00 p.m. Only qualified voters, having property subject to taxation by City of Rankin or Upton County, and who have resided within the city limits for at least six months, will be eligible to cast a ballot.

Absentee voting in the election was closed Monday with what amounted to a heavy vote for absentee in a city election. Qualified property owners are estimated to be 250-300 in the city. A simple majority will be needed to approve or defeat the proposal.

The tax, which is levied directly on those who use telephone service, has been included on monthly telephone bills, and each month your tax payment has been sent on to the federal government. In effect, the telephone company has been a collection agency.

When the excise tax is eliminated in 1969, telephone users in Texas will save more than \$50 million annually. This will mean more than \$4 million a month added to Texans' spendable income.




