Fading out of St. Augustine or carpet grass is prevalent in many areas of the state beginning with the hot season.
Some growers incorrectly refer o it as brown patch but this occures in the cooler weather of spring and fal. Brown patch can be identified by the fact that eaves are easily pulled from the stolons, appear in a circular pattern and the stolons are not killed. The opposite of these is
true with fading out.
Certain insects such as chinch
bues may cause symptoms that can be confused with fading out Presence or absence of insects
