There have been many horm ones placed on the market in the past few years that are suppos ed to influence the reproductive efficiency, but according to all research on these hormones by the experiment stations, the fol. lowing is the conclusion that has been published by James A. Gray Extension animal husbandman. 1. Estrogen administration anestural ewes will readilly pro. duce heat or estrus but this is not usually accompanied by ovulation.
2. Administration of PMS to anestural ewes will produce ovu lation which is not generally ac.

## 3. Combinations

 tropins have produced erratic results in producing hea and ovulation simultaneously. It might be concluded that they are generally not dependable4. Synchronization of estrus in cycling ewes is possible. The re. productive rate is higher at the second heat period following synchronization.
5. The hormonal balance of the ewe is very sensitive and very difficult to control with any de gree of success.
6. At the present time most hormonal treatments involve too great a cost in time, labor and
materials to be practical for com mercial sheep producers.
Last year in Upton County two ranchers used Vitamin ADE at breeding time and there was no significant difference in 1 amb crop peront. However, the ewes were in good shape at breeding time last year.
In Crane County during the drought, ADE was used on a flock of ewes and there was a 20 per. cent difference in the treated group and the control group. One might conclude from this that during a hard breeding season it might pay to use some type of hormonal treatment.
This year two ranchers in the county have used PMS and a re port will be made in the spring on the results of this type control breeding demonstration. However, up to this date seems that the natural factor such as age, age of ewes, temp erature, daylight hours and nut rition are still the main factor that influence the percent lamb produced from any given numbe of ewes.
