You Gotta Pay Tax; Even on Babysitters

All household employers who paid an employee \$50 or more in cash during the October - November - December quarter must file a social security tax report by January 31, according to the district Social Security Manager. Domestic employees classified as such include baby sitters, housekeepers, maids and other household help and all are covered by social security. The wages must be reported if a total of \$50 or more in cash is paid to one employees in a calendar quarter.

The employer should deduct 4.4 percent of the employee's earnings. The employer is responsible for matching the amount of the employee's taxes from his own funds and sending a total of 8.8 percent of the employee's wages along with the report.
