Buying Fertilizer --

Buying fertilizer for the lawn and garden need not be a task. Saving money may be important, but the economics of buying a few bags of fertilizer are not as important a buying quantities. However, you can save by avoiding small packages.

You may pay 10 to 20 times more for fertilizer in the one-pound size compared to an 80-pound bag. Farm-sized bags of 80 pounds are not too much fertilizer for anyone with a vegetable garden, flower beds and a lawn.

All fertilizer containers must be properly labeled. This means there is no excuse to be misinformed about the merits of the product, although you may be misled by extravagant claims in words and pictures. Read the label before you buy.

Don't be misled by claims of how many square feet a fertilizer will cover. What counts is whether you are applying enough of the proper material to give your plants the nutrients they need.

Soil tests can be used to determine the kind and amounts of plant food needed for lawns and gardens as well as for field crops and pastures. Information on soil testing is available at my office.

Money Planning --

Realism is one of the keywords in the vocabulary of planning for spending. A good plan can't make two dollars do the work of three, or reform a spendthrift, or al. ter readilly a family's way of spending money. However, it can and should reflect the family's goals, needs and interests. And, of course, it should take into account past financial history (for instance, debts to be paid off-and any benefits avail. able on the job-group life and health insurance, pension plans, social security, etc.)

Another key is "first things first." For every family there are fixed items, payments that have to be met—rent, heat, utilities, insurance premiums. Then comes an emergency fund for the unexpected and the allocation for day-to-day expenses (food, running the household and the car). After these have been taken care of, any workable plan includes an

order of priorities for the distribution of money left over.

Perhaps the most important word in talking about spending plans is "attitude". The actual system adopted makes little difference. What counts is how well and how consistantly it's used. It's no coincidence that financial troubles seem to haunt families who resort to a spending plan only in times of difficulty and abandon it until the next crisis appears on the horizon. A wiser course is to use a plan for spending not as a remedy but as preventive medicine for financial illness.
