As you all know, Congress is in the process of taking care of all of us taxpayers. They are going to rewrite the income tax law and plug up some of the loopholes so that everyone pays his fair share. As picked up from last week's Wink Bulletin, here is one of the proposals that is going to make it easier for all of us. It is from the proposed Tax Reform Act of 1969 (H.R. 13270)
Here is part of Sec. 277, "Limitation on Deductions for Iindividuals":
"(a) General Rule-If a taxpayer (other than a corporation) has allocable expenses for a tax able year, the deduction otherwise allowable under this chapter for such expenses shall be disallowed
