The clipping tells how Flowers recently picked up several "hot" wires and moved them off a highway following a plane crash into a power line. The report states that spectators stood aghast because he wore no gloves or insulation. His deed cleared the area until an electrical service crew arrived.

Flowers didn't think it was such a great thing since he was wearing his artificial legs which, un like metal attachments formerly used, were made of plastic and he knew he was well insulated.
spokesman for the Public Service company said the broken wires carried 13,200 volts of electricity.
Now friends, that takes kind of nerve for a man to do thing like that after having lost both legs and almost his life withstanding.
