## RHS GRAD GETS SCHOLARSHIP FOR geOSCIENCE WORK AT TEXAS TECH

Lubbock - Terry Gray, a graduate student in Texas Tech University's Department of Geosciences was presented a $\$ \$ 00$ scholarship grant by Pennzoil United, Inc. on Nov. 9.
Gary, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Billy Gray of Rankin, is a graduate of Rankin High School and this marks the secoad time he has received a substantial scholarship while at Tech. In addition to the $\$ 500$ presented November 9 , the oil firm has offered to pay for certain other portions of Gray's school costs.
Another grant in the amount of $\$ 500$ was presented by the company to the department to further research and instructional programs in the area of geascience at Texas Tech
Gray plans to go into exploration geolegy following competion of his master's degree in geosciences at Tech.

## Salvation Army Expenditures Told
