Road Tax Axed by Upton Voters

Upton County voters apparently did not agree with their Commissioners Court, the one who had called a Farm to Market and Lateral Roads Tax election, and, as a result, defeated the proposition by an overall vote of 285 for and 911 against. A simple majority was necessary for passage.
Actually, votes were cast in the election in two different categories, property owners and non property owners. In both cases, it suffered the same fate, going down 257 to 750 for the property owner vote, and $128-161$ for nonproperty owners.
Precinct 1 property owners voted 94 for and 125 against; nonproperty owners, 40 for and 24 against.
In Precinct 2. it was 37 for and 47 against for property owners; and 22 for and 16 against in the non-property owner bracket.
