Golf Team Whips It on Big for State Title

Class A golf in Texas. Not only did the Red Devils win the state title they posted a new record for Class A at 634, breaking the old record, according to the San Antonio Light, of 643, set in 1967 by Albany.

Although not in contention with them Coach Turner's linksters not only beat second place Sonora by 25 shots in Class A, they also posted a better score than did any team in Class AA or AAA. Orly two or three of the biggies in AAAA outshot the Red Devils.

And their game was solid from top to bottm. Led by Freshman Gary Varnadore, who was State medalist and Junior Terry Lester runner-up state medalist, all five members of the Red Devil fievsome outshot their opponents from Sonora. Edgewood of Dallas and Lackland of San Antonio. Using only the four best overall scores the Devils would have won by using any combination of their five players.

WELL CANCEL MY STAMP -





Late Friday the House of Representatives was still working on a controversial revision of the controlled substances act. In particular, most interest centered on the changes in penalties for possession of marihuana. In a Saturday session members were expected to deliberate on a version of competitive rating for insurance. In next week's report, I will deal with both these issues in some detail.

After a full seven days of debate the House passed its 9.7 billion spending bill for the financing of the state for the next two years.

As I have pointed out in the past, it is a balanced budget in that it will not require any new taxes. The Senate has also passed its version of the spending bill which differs in many respects from the House bill. Now both bills will be sent to a conference


