Rankin to Get Paving, New Ambulance --

County Plans Revenue Sharing Fund Expenditures

a recent series of sessions, have disclosed plans for several expenditures from the money that the county has received as their portion of the Federal Revenue Sharing Plan, started last year by the U. S. Government.

Currently the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund, held by Upton County. contains some \$91,000 with another payment anticipated about the 15th of June in the area of \$20-\$25 thousand. Of the total received by the county since the Sirst receipt of funds, the court has spent approximately \$22,000 for new dump

Currently out for bidding is a plan to pay 80 percent of the cost of a new ambulance for the Rankin County Hospital District - the District to pay the other 20 percent-and bids on renovations and additions to the county jail in Rankin.

In a meeting earlier this month the court accepted the bid of American Petrofina Co. of Big Spring in the amount of .1405c per gallon for emulsified asphalt to be used in upcoming street and road improvements. Of the total amount of this material. 94,500 63.700 to Rankin, and 12.000 to El Paso Natural Gas camp, some 10 miles east of Crane.



I have had a number of inquiries concerning the Texas Sunday Closing Law. Texas has had "blue laws" since 1840. The present law which bans certain purchases on Sunday was enacted during the 57th Legislature in 1961.

During the last session in 1971, there was an attempt to repeal the law I supported the move to repeal, but it failed. This session a joint resolution was introduced to put the issue of repeal of the "blue laws" on the constitutional ballot. I supported the resolution which failed to receive the necessary two-thirds vote to appear on the ballot. This is one of many issues that may come up during the upcoming Constitutional Revision Session in January.

The bill which I co-sponsored to elevate all the domestic relations courts in Texas to the status of full district courts has passed the House and has been sent to the Senate for its consideration.




