Powdery mildew is one of the most destructive diseases on certain ornamentals and vegetables. It attacks roses, crape myrtle, photinia and zinnias as well as melons and cucumbers.

The disease reduces yeild and weakens plants by attacking the buds, young leaves and growing

## tips. On young leaves the disease

 appears at first as bppears at first as slightiy raised. blister-like areas that soon become covered with a grayish-white powdery growth. As the leaves expand, they become curled distorted. Tiny black fruiting ies of the mildew fungus are often embedded in the mildew ten embedded in the mildew patcson.

The control of powdery mildew requires certain sanitation procedures as well as the application of certain fungicides.
In the fall remove and destroy all diseased annuals and prune back diseased parts of perennials to help reduce the source of new infections in the spring.

Good air circulation among the plants will reduce the possibility of powdery mildew. Avoid over. crowding and planting in a damp low area.
The fungidides. Benlate and Karathane, can be used to control the disease in the home garden, and either Actidone, Benlate, Karathane or sulfur can be used on ornamentals. Fungicide applications should begin in the spring when new growth develops or immediately after the first sign of powdery mildew. Applications can also be made during the flowering period to prevent blossom blight.
Apply fungicides at seven-day
intervals or as needed Actidone, Karathane and sulfur should be used at a temperature below 85 degrees. Applying these materials above this temperature will burn the plant.

## Accounting Made of Activity Funds

In a final accounting to the Rankin School Boards of Trustees for the school term ended, the RHS School Activity Fund showed an ending balance of $\$ 2,483.22$ in the Control Account- a combination of all funds.

The Band account was at plus \$486.05, Student Council was ahead by $\$ 65.36$, while the National Honor Society still had \$49.18.
For the Pep Squad, it was a balance of $\$ 19.18$, the FHA account contained $\$ 25.59$ and the Science Club had $\$ 59.06$ in the pot. Future Teachers Association was in the black by $\$ 7.24$.
Two of the big accounts made up the remainder. These included the annual account with $\$ 1,403.57$ in its favor while the Supply Account was overdrawn by $\$ 1,073.01$.
