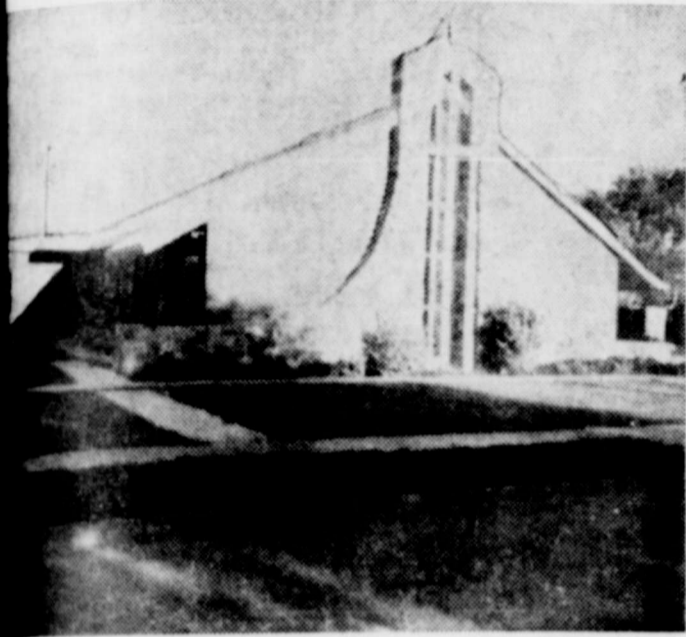

Architect Hired to Submit Three Plans --

Court to Study Plans for Further Improvements

In a Special Session held Monday, July 23, the Commissioner's Court signed an agreement with the architectural firm of Peters & Fields of Odessa to draw up plans for additions to the Rankin and McCamey Library and the Rankin Swimming Pool bath house. In the case of the bath house, the court will also consider the possibility of building an entirely new structure, which might cost less

than to repair the present one, built 20 years ago in 1953.

For the Rankin Library, plans are to add on a reading room area on the east side of the building. The last addition to the Rankin Library was made in the mid-1950's.

Also approved at the Monday session was the proposed plan to spend \$5000 on renovation of the first floor of the Yates Hotel and to use it as a County Museum. Work is expected to begin shortly on this project with county employees doing the labor.

All approved and proposed expenditures are to be made from the Upton County Revenue Sharing Trust Fund.

In other matters, the Court voted to pay the Chief Deputy Sheriff of Upton County \$23 per day for each day of duty in excess of their regular working days per week and the Upton Deputy Sheriffs, \$21 per day for their overtime duty.

Gene Astell, convicted robbery and armed assault, facing sentences of 99 years, is presently in the Upton County Jail. Sheriff S. O. "Sid" Langhovever, that his stay in County would be a short one as he would be transferred to Huntsville Thursday.

Astell was given a 99 year sentence by a jury in District Court for his March 2, 1972 robbery of Security State Bank in McCamey. His attorney, from Fort Worth, appealed the case and that Astell be transferred to Pecos County jail in order that he be closer to hand for pre-trial proceedings.

While he was confined to County jail that he and other prisoners made a successful escape. All the others were captured shortly thereafter. Astell who eluded capture earlier this month was picked up in Las Cruces, Calif. in a narcotics raid by the APD Vice Squad.

Museum Consultant to Work in this Area in Pilot Program

In an announcement made Saturday, July 21, it was revealed that the Rankin area would be included as a part of a pilot program in which a special museum field consultant will work in the Permian Basin area.

This new program will be conducted by the Historical Survey Committee through an appropriation of state funds.

Although no certain person has been employed at this time, it has been revealed that he will be a professional field consultant who will work with Permian Basin Museums and with other museums in the West Texas area. He will provide his services at no charge to any museum in the region which requests them. He will be available to give advice on lighting, exhibits, conservation of artifacts, accessioning, cataloguing and virtually every aspect of museum operation.

His employment is expected to begin around September 1 of this year and he will likely be used in an advisory capacity in setting up the new Upton County Museum to be located in the Yates Hotel in Rankin.

If this pilot program is successful, state funding will be requested to expand it to other areas of the state.

Wildlife Goes Harvested

— Kill a deer with a Well, not exactly, but the Parks and Department can tell you deer were harvested the previous season when filled and from where successful hunters came. 1972-73 season, an esti-

imated 362,178 white tailed deer, 14,414 mule deer and 35,740 turkeys were harvested.

Of the whitetail figure, 75 percent of the kill were buck deer and virtually 100 percent of the mule deer harvested were buck animals.

Gobblers represented 86 percent of the total turkey harvest figure.

It is estimated that in the 72-73 season, there were some 517,000 white tailed deer hunters in the state, 37,000 mule deer hunters and 103,000 turkey hunters.

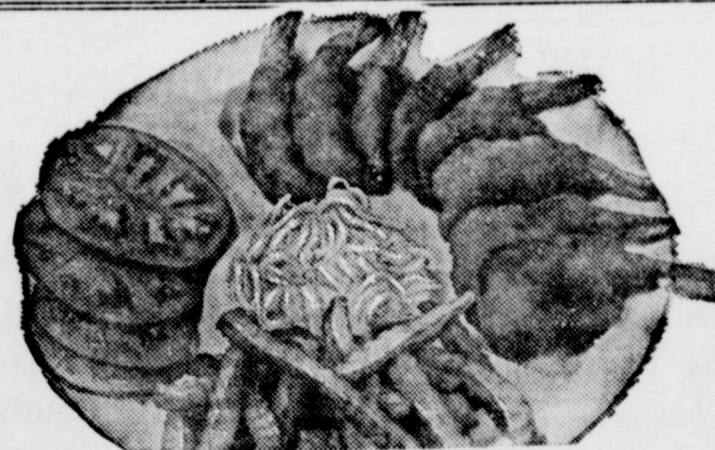

Upton Pecaners

Take a 1st in State

Upton County Pecan growers did well at the State Pecan Show held this past week in New Braunfels.

Mr. LeRoy Grigsby had the 1st place Garner at the show, followed in 3rd place by E. G. Wilkerson. In the Mahan class, Wilkerson took a 2nd. They were in competition with all the Regional Show Winners from all over the State of Texas.

Denisa Day was 3rd Runner-Up in the Queen's Pageant.

At the show the Upton County growers had a booth showing all the pecan work that is going on in the county. It was a slideset and tape strip telling and showing all the things that were going on in pecan work. This drew around 300 people at the show.

This month and next month the pecan trees need an extra amount of water since this is the month to size and fill nuts on the tree. Also, check for aphids on the trees and if as many as 25 are found on 10 leaves, it is time to hit them with Sevin or Malathion spray. Also, include 1 tablespoon per gallon of zinc sulfate in the spray.

The date for the Trans Pecos Show has been set for November 19th.

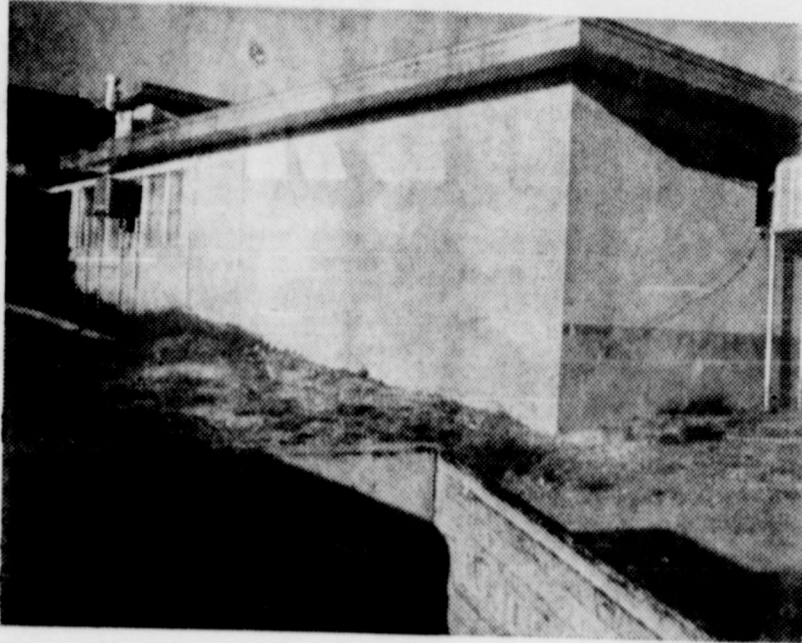
