Subscription Drive Nearly Half Over

Only three more weeks remain in the annual Rankin News Bargain Subscription rates offer. All subscriptions will revert to their regular prices, effective Sept. 1.

During August, all subscribers with addresses listed inside Upton County may renew or purchase a new subscription for \$3.25 per year. Outside Upton mailing addresses are going at \$4, both a 50c reduction.

An added reduction of 50-cents per subscription may be earned by payment for two years or more or by paying more than one subscription. All who pay in person at the News Office receive a free 19c Bic ball point.

As noted in last week's issue of the News, no new subscriptions are being taken at this time on out-of-county mailing addresses with the exception of Midland, Odessa, and San 'Angelo. To this list has now been added Alpine.







1. Eligibility, Purchaser

A, must have served at least 90 days continuous active military duty, unless sooner discharged for reasons of service connected disability after Sept. 16, 1940, and until the United States Forces are formally withdrawn from Viet Nam.

B. Closing Fee. \$130.

C. Down Payment of 5 percent. V. Terms of Contract

A. 40 years, payable on or before without penalty.

B. Interest rate, 51/2 percent.

C. Payments, semi-annually

A. Two or more veterans cannot purchase undivided interests in a tract of land-
