

Dates for the 25th Annual Upton County 4-H Club's All-Kid Rodeo and Horse Show have been set on Friday, May 31, and Saturday, June 1. Performance time for the '74 show has been changed from the previous 8 p.m. to a 7:30 p.m. starting time.

A parade for Friday has been scheduled for 6 p.m.

Light Turnout Marks Upton Balloting --

Saturday's Judge Race Was Real Barn Burner

Prior to election day last Saturday, most folk were saying that the four-way race for the County Judge's seat being vacated at the end of this term would be a close affair. And it was. Two candidates, Walter Campbell and Peggy Garner tied with 371 votes, followed closely by Frank Robbins with 318 and Shank Bloxom with 271. Campbell and Garner advanced to the June 6 Run-Off election.

Over in McCamey, incumbent Commissioner Charlie Fletcher lost to Boob Kelton in another close race, 214-237, in Precinct 4. In Rankin Commissioner Precinct 2 incumbent Tommy Workman and challenger Shorty Titsworth put on still another close race with Workman winning 112 to 97.

Allen Moore easily carried his home county in the 21st Congresional race, polling 927 votes of the total 1340 cast; however, he was "steam-rollered" in the big city voting areas by Nelson Wolff and Bob Krueger who will meet in the June Run-Off. Wolff polled 146 votes in Upton County and Krueger got 122.

A light turnout of the more than 2000 eligible voters in the county marked the balloting. Absentees accounted for 183, Precinct 1 had 201; Precinct 2, 143; Precinct 3, 400; and Precinct 4, 413. Absentee votes contained some ballots from all four precincts.

Jim C. Langdon, running unopposed for Railroad Commissioner, was the top county vote-getter at 1079.

A breakdown of the judge race shows the following: Absentee — Bloxom, 65; Campbell, 43; Robbins, 41; and Garner, 32;

Precinct 1: Bloxom, 112; Garner 39; Robbins, 32; and Campbell, 20.


