## County Tax Roll

## Values Show Gain

Minutes of the Commissioners Court meeting of October 14 reveal, among other items, that tax roll values for Upton County have now reached $\$ 60,186,574$. This is the highest tax value for the county within the past several years and reflects the increased oil activity within the area.
