



Now all this doesn't have any great deal to do with the Pecos River, directly; but it does point out that some people, in this instance those in Carlsbad, can take a not-so-big river and make a nice attraction for themselves as well as tourists while others will let that same river run past their doorstep and do nothing. Well, almost nothing. I've read where the State of Texas has taken the State of New Mexico to court, charging that the New Mexicans are taking more water out of the Pecos River than they are supposed to take out.

It's alright for them to It's doubtful that anything will ever come of this and even if it re can go over there and did and the Pecos flowed twice as much water, it wouldn't do much good. You see, in Texas, landowners who happen to have property through which a river flows, can charge their fellow Texans for "fishing rights" in that 'river—even though it does not "belong" to the landowner. Out in New Mexico, that sort of thing doesn't go—the rivers and streams belong to the people of the state—and that's not a bad arrangement in my opinion.

Still, given the full flow of the Pecos, it's doubtful that Texans, considering their past track record, would bother to do anything with the river other than ignore it.


