During the past thirty years there has been an increase of the farming population of 5,270,907, while all other industrial pursuits number but 4,051,103. How is this great relative difference to be accounted for? Unquestionably by the extraordinary encouragement offered by the United States government, through its pre-emption and homestead laws, to all whom it might concern, by which millions of acres of American soil have been settled and devoted to farming interests. While certain manufacturing interests have, from time to time, received the protecting care of legislation, it is to be remembered

that the nation has been offering the highest inducements, has been paying an enormous premium, by way of stimulating agricultural pursuits. To largely increase our measures of prosperity, "we have taken advantage of our exceptional position as owners of an immense area of virgin land to make the new farmer a virtual present of the most important of the raw materials as well as of the site for pursuing that industry."

Without raising the issue here whether mining or manufactures would show a corresponding result if they had received equal encouragement or analogous treatment from the national government, it is certainly seen by the above exhibit the overwhelming interests that are involved in agriculture in this country, and the duty which is ours, growing out of these dominating interests.

Farmers, above all others, should realize the significance of their work, the justice of their claims, and the demand which a waiting world makes upon their success.

TO make a wash for fruit trees: To a bush two thirds full of ordinary stone lime whirled, add one pint gas tar, one pound whale oil soap dissolved in hot water, or one half pound potash, or one pint strong lye. Add clay to make the mixture thick enough to be applied with a large brush. Applied in early spring and late in autumn. Remove the earth at foot, down to the collar, and wash the tree from earth as high up as can be reached.
