WOODWORK BY DALTON

A COUPLE of bills involving parents and children appeared well on their way toward passage in the Texas Legislature this week. Both of them are good bills, if they do what they are supposed to do.

One of these would require parents of juvenile delinquents to pay for damages done by their little darlings up to \$5,000. This has been passed by both houses of the Legislature, and to youngsters from 10 to 18 who damage public or privately owned property. We've seen the time when some kids around here probably would have been home in bed on Saturday nights after 11 p. m. If the parents knew they would have to pay for the damages.

The bill was prompted by the number of cases where homes and schools were being wrecked by vandals, and also it applies to such cases as false fire alarms and other acts of vandalism.

Another measure, still in committee, would extend the waiting period from 60 to 180 days before a divorce is granted, where children under 18 are involved. The sponsors of this bill feel it would provide a check on hasty, ill-conceived divorces and remarriages, thereby giving added protection to children involved.

This probably would work better than the suggestion of British divorce judge last week that any couple who wants a divorce should be granted one simply by mutual consent, with this notable exception: he would grant no divorces to parents of children under a certain age (12, I think).

Graduates Invited To Court Reporting Discussion

A little known profession in the fast moving world today is shorthand reporting, stated Bobby G. Rogers, Official Court Reporter for the 154th Judicial District. He said there was an acute shortage in trained reporters over the nation.

This profession would like to interest high school graduates in this area.

Rogers stated that there were four major classifications of court reporters: court reporters who record the testimony in court trials; hearing reporters who record government hearings; legislative reporters who work in the United States and various state legislatures; and finally, general or free-lance reporters who, like the doctor and the lawyer, practice for themselves on specific assignments.

Of approximately 10,000 reporters over the nation, Rogers reported that 60 percent are men and 40% women. He added that in the next five to 10 years the number of present reporters must be doubled to accommodate the rising demand for reporters. This demand is due partly to lower courts becoming record courts and thereby requiring a reporter, as well as the population explosion.

Beginning reporter salaries range from \$5,600 to \$10,000 per annum, plus additional pay for transcriptions.

Rogers urged young men and women who are high school and college graduates to acquaint themselves with the possibility of a career in shorthand reporting.

VBS Dates Schools Must Integrate Here

It was decided at the regularly scheduled school board meeting of Sudan school district held Monday night, that full integration of the school system must go into effect at the beginning of the 1965-66 school term. Supt.

W. E. Hancock stated that it had been planned to leave the first three grades segregated, but that upon receiving a letter from the U. S. Commissioner of Education, plans for integrating all 12 grades are being carried out.

At the present time no plans for disposing of the Collins school have been made. The Negro enrollment of approximately 80 students is expected to be about the same next school term. School board members also discussed at length and proposed a schedule whereas most of the 20 insurance policies covering school property could be renewed at the same time instead of throughout the year.

Interviews are being scheduled for the applicants for the head coaching position still open in the faculty. Other faculty matters included the rehiring of Hank Brown as girls basketball coach and head of girls physical education department. Brown has filled this capacity for the past 12 years during which time Sudan has produced several winning girls basketball teams.
