IT'S NOT THAT I don't trust the United States government, nor would I suggest that any agency of the government would deliberately mislead the people, but I do wonder sometimes at the figures on enemy casualties that we are given.

It's grim and sad news to read last week, for example, that 789 American troops were killed in action during the first 14 days of the Viet Cong's spring offensive. But the comparison with the number of enemy supposedly killed kind of stretches credulity.

The same story noted that the allied commands reported 4,063 Viet Cong and North Vietnamese battle dead in one week, and 6,813 the previous week, bringing the total enemy killed to 10,876.

The summary for the war according to figures given to the Associated Press, show 32,712 Americans killed in action since Jan. 1, 1961. The enemy had 461,256 killed in those eight years, according to Allied sources.

Seems to me they'd be about out of people, if they'd had that many killed.

Everyone is invited to attend.

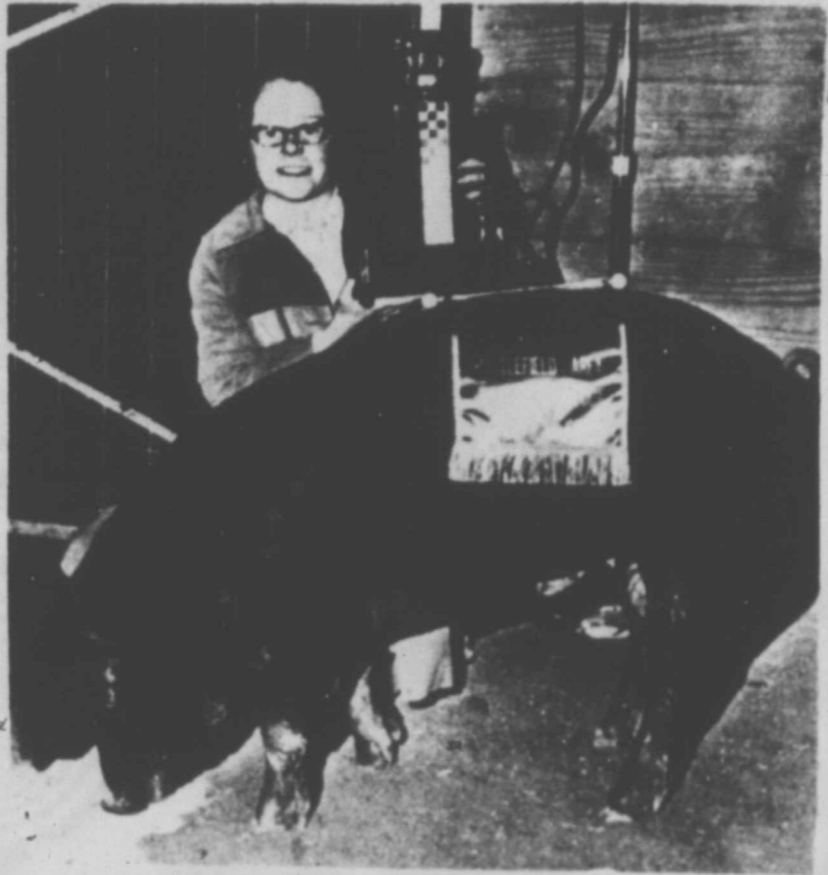
OES CHAPTER HOLDS MEETING
